The Minister for Health has now authorised the offer of Vaccination against Poliomyelitis to children in the age groups

3-4 years and 4-5 years (1) Applications are invited from parents of children born within the period 1st July 1952 to the 30th June 1954, inclusive who desire to have them vaccinated against

(2) Applications should be made to the County Medical Officer Arus Brugha Dungaryan and should state clearly the name and address of the parent and the full name

and DATE OF BIRTH of the child The course consists of three injections The vaccine is expensive and only parents who are determined to com-

plete the course should apply No guarantee is given that the vaccine will give full pro tection in every child vaccinated or as to the period for which this protection will last. It has been used however in other countries with favourable results

The parent of each child who is accepted for vaccination will be notified when and where to bring it for injection The vaccination will be free of charge

Latest gate for receiving applications is Thursday, July 25th Applications received after that date cannot be accepted for the present campaign


