AGRICULTURAL COMMITTEE NOT CO-OPERATING WITH PARISH AGENTS

Allegation At Meeting

On the recommendation of the Local Appointments Commissioners County Waterford Committee of Agriculture at their monthly meeting in Dungarvan on Saturday last appointed William J Cooke B.A. S. Lower Kilkenny, Kilkenny, as permanent whole-time Instructor in Agriculture.

The C.A.O. Mr P Conroy told Mr P Heskin that Mr Cooke would fill the vacancy caused by the resignation last year of Mr Prendergast.

Replying to Mr J Quirk the C.A.O. said that Mr Barlow who is the present holder of a temporary post under the Committee was appointed "to fill a vacuum which existed." There were now three permanent Agricultural Instructors besides the temporary ones in the county he said.

Questioned by Mr W Dower who referred to the activities of Parish Agents in the County (Armore-Clashmore area and Ballyduff area) the C.A.O. stated that he did not follow just because a Parish Agent operated in a particular district that the people of that district would be deprived of one of the Committee's services.

"After all," said Mr Conroy they are ratepayers and as such are entitled to the services provided by the Committee.

Serious Question

Mr W Foran asked if it was true that there was no co-operation between Instructors and officials of the Committee and the Parish Agents in the County.

"If this is correct," said Mr Foran "then the agricultural community must be an awful lot of fools and the position must strike any sensible person as being very serious. Surely if the Department have authorised the placing of Parish Agents within the County and if the Committee of Agriculture appoint one for a similar area it is a scandal. The C.A.O. is a sad state of affairs," he added "that although both are there to improve production and boost exports that no co-operation exists between them. It is a pity that the C.A.O. is said to have fiddled while Rome burned but we're fiddling for a long time too long and the Agricultural community have suffered as a result."

Mr D Heskin thought that the operation of the Parish Plan would eliminate the necessity of making further permanent appointments.

Mr J Quirk said that a Parish Agent was working in the Ballyduff area and he had heard of no friction between him and the Committee's Instructors and Officials. The only difference between the Parish Agent and one of the Committee's Instructors that he saw was that one was paid by the ratepayers and the other by the ratepayers.

Mr N Walsh stated that he understood it the Parish Plan which he had not welcomed, was to supplement and not supplant the activities of the Committee.

Mr H Dowd pointed out that the Parish Agents now working in the County had been appointed by the Committee's request. He had opposed the introduction of the plan as he felt that they were bartering a certain amount of the power under their control and for motives of economy that they were frittering away the rights of the Committee.

Mr Foran said that they had more Instructors in the County now than ever before but he asked if we can't have co-operation between them we might as well abandon some of them altogether.

Urgent Harmony

Mr Foran's statement came as a complete surprise to him "As far as I am personally aware," stated the C.A.O. "we have always given and received every co-operation from the two Parish Agents, and as a matter of fact they have got the use of certain equipment from our office whatever about any other else as far as know the utmost cordiality and harmony exists between the Parish Agents and the Committee's Instructors in this County."

Mr Foran then proposed that the two Parish Agents be invited to the next meeting to give their views on agricultural problems, but it was finally agreed to adopt a suggestion made by the C.A.O. that all the Parish Agents be invited to the Committee's meeting in September.

The July meeting of the County Waterford Libraries Committee was held in the Courthouse, Dungarvan on Tuesday 16th July.

It was agreed that a special meeting of the section be held in September next to formulate definite recommendations on these points for submission to the Department.

Wednesday Afternoon

The Public Library and the Farmer by P E Forde Dip. Agr. Sc.

This from a County Library point of view was the most important part of the symposium. Mr Forde emphasized the lacunae in the present system of education in rural National Schools. There was no co-ordination between the school programme and the daily life and interests of agricultural communities.

I spoke to this paper and outlined what had been accomplished in our own and other

at last Saturday's monthly meeting of the County Waterford Committee of Agriculture in Dungarvan Mr N Walsh stated that in future he would oppose any going abroad of any of the Committee's Officials in any shape or form.

He said in view of the present economic position and the need for the Committee to play its part in setting things right, these educational tours he said, were really only in the nature of good holidays for the officials.

Mr W Foran agreed that they would have to put the brakes on as regards tours outside the country. The Instructors he said, already had ample knowledge if they could get it over to the farmers and there should be no need for them to go to foreign countries for more.

Mr H Dowd held the opposite view and said that the tours were valuable as they broadened the knowledge of the Instructors.

The CAO said that if they were to bury their heads in the sand and say that they knew everything already they might as well fold up all their schemes. There was a lot to be learned from such courses.

With regard to the tour he had just returned from in England he told Mr Walsh that he could not have been better employed anywhere else attending the course as he had gained a lot of knowledge from it.

The discussion ended when Mr Walsh said that he was only expressing a personal view on which he did not wish the Committee to take any action at the moment.

Price Of Eggs

On the proposal of Mr D Heskin seconded by Mr J Quirk the Committee agreed to guarantee a minimum price of 2/6d. per dozen for eggs.

Wheat Purchases

The Committee also passed a resolution proposed by Mr. H. Dower, calling on the Department to ensure that all wheat offered for sale be accepted by the millers subject to the approval of the Department.
