SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

Elsewhere in this issue I have taken to task (for the second time) for comments which I made in recent weeks about the award of secondary and university scholarships. On this occasion the criticism comes from a leader in Birmingham. Let me say at once that I was most impressed at the case made against me but, cogent as Mr. Forrest's argument is, I see no reason to alter or withdraw any of the points which I have raised on this issue. I have no axe to grind against the award of scholarships. I have previously stated on a number of occasions that such a scheme is a very laudable one. The main reason I referred to the matter was to say that as a means test operates in the scheme, it should be rigidly enforced or else abolished.

EMIGRANT'S ADDRESS

Mr. Joe McCarthy back in his home of Dungarvan for the first time since he left it in 1916 to go to New York, addressed a meeting of the Urban Council at last Friday night. He mentioned the many changes for the better of course which had taken place in the Old Boro during the last forty years. A report of Mr. McCarthy's address appears elsewhere in this issue. Worthy of particular note is the interest which Mr. McCarthy stated emigrants in New York take in local affairs as reported in the *Dungarvan Leader*.

A BOMBHELL

The loss of approximately £200 a year for the next 50 years (the estimate of the Government in respect of 17 houses at the Caseyville housing scheme in Dungarvan came as a bombshell to Dungarvan Urban Council members at last Friday night's meeting. The ratapaners of the town are still discussing it. Somebody it seems failed to carry out their duty with the result that this fine has now been placed by the Department on the people of the town. It is a very serious matter that has caused there was bungling in the carrying out of these demolition orders that £10,000 should be lost by the town, I sincerely hope that a full inquiry will be held into the affair and as it is more or less a sub-judice so to say I will refrain from further comment at present.

WHAT ARE THE FACTS

With the All-Ireland Hurling Final was played on Sunday 16 September there were several excursions organised by C.T.E. to bring hurling fans from the County to Dublin. I had certain criticisms to make subsequently which were accepted as reasonable and just. Other people however, just threw the book at C.T.E. and at all its employees at Dungarvan and made sweeping and general inability on their part to deal with public transport problems. I refuted these statements but a further attempt was made to discredit C.T.E. and what were called facts were produced and published. Among these facts was a letter which was supposed to emanate from Kilmacthomas to support certain criticisms. This "letter" inter alia stated "The Dublin trip though not so bad as it was a nightmare too. Who can forget the Kingsbridge scramble for seats."
