BISHOP OPENS NEW CHURCH IN RATHGORMACK

Replaces 150 Years Old Structure

Last Sunday was a memorable occasion in the history of the parish of Rathgormack in County Waterford. It was the day on which the fruits of 18 years' efforts were reaped when His Lordship, Most Rev. Dr. Daniel Cohalan, D.D. Bishop of Waterford and Lismore opened their new Church of the Sacred Heart.

FIRST PUBLIC MASS

In rain and wind which at times reached gale force, over 500 people packed the beautiful church on the hillside overlooking the village for the first public Mass which was celebrated by Rev. G. Purcell, C.C. His Lordship the Bishop presided and was attended by Venerable Archdeacon D. Power, P.P., V.F., Dungarvan for whom the occasion was a happy realization of a dream that had its beginning as a boy in his native parish of Rathgormack and was carried towards a reality many years later when the Parish Priest was given the site free of charge by Mr. James Phelan.

Also in attendance to His Lordship was Very Rev. Michael O'Byrne, P.P., Carrick-on-Suir. Also present were Very Rev. J. Canon Kieley, P.P. Portlaur, Very Rev. M. Hackett, P.P., Ballinacorney and Aglish (who also played a part in the 18-year old drive to give Rathgormack a new church). Very Rev. T. Power, P.P. Clonheen, Very Rev. M. Power, P.P. Knockanore, Very Rev. T. O'Brien, P.P. Ballyneale Rev. R. Byrne, C.C. Dungarvan, Rev. R. Keane, D.D. Secretary and Rev. J. Mulcahy, C.C. Rathgormack. The Parish Priest of Rathgormack Very Rev. L. Vereker, was also in attendance.

The sermon was preached by Dr. Cohalan, B.A., Professor, St. John's College, Waterford. The new church will cost in all £37,000. To date a sum of over £20,000 has been raised and the campaign will go on until every penny is paid off. It is an attractive and imposing structure and replaces the old church at the foot of the hill now a silent monument to 150 years noble service to the parishioners. It is designed to accommodate a congregation of 400 and is of Romanesque design adapted to fit and harmonise with its natural surroundings.

BISHOP'S ADDRESS

In his address to the congregation His Lordship Most Rev. Dr. Cohalan stated that the words 'Church of the Sacred Heart' is magnificent. There is nothing cheap nothing flimsy about anything that went into the building of it. Everything in it is worthy of its purpose and will last longer than any of ourselves. I feel identified with you on this great occasion and I too, am happy at the opening of this your church. Already, people have come to see it to admire it. It is modest, it is inspiring, it is solid and it is lasting. On no other occasion have I been so much associated with the erection of a church.

His Lordship urged the people of Rathgormack to continue the fine work that made that day possible. Much had been achieved but there was much more to be achieved. He would like to see in the future the words 'Sacred Heart' would specify a real homely personal meaning to each person in that parish. The Bishop expressed his thanks to Mr. James Phelan for donating the site to the architect Messrs. Robinson, Keefe and Devane Dublin the general contractors Messrs. John Hearne & Son, Ltd. Waterford also the sub-contractors who also thanked the County Council and County Engineer for their excellent co-operation. The ceremonies concluded with Solemn Benediction imparted by His Lordship, assisted by Rev. Fr. Purcell, Rev. Fr. Mulcahy, Rev. Fr. Keane, and Rev. Fr. Fitzgerald.

LAND COMMISSION HAS 700 ACRES FOR DISPOSAL IN COUNTY WATERFORD

When Mr. W. Keeneally T.D. asked the Minister for Lands in the Dail to state what proposals were before the Land Commission regarding the acquisition and division of estates in County Waterford he was told by Mr. Childers that proceedings had been instituted for the compulsory acquisition or resumption of three properties comprising 192 acres while negotiations were in progress for the voluntary purchase of six estates comprising a further 1,609 acres. In addition, enquiries were being made in respect of sixteen estates comprising 1,285 acres.

FISH FREIGHT RATES

Mr. Childers also told Mr. Keeneally that subject to the completion of some minor formalities arrangements for the bulk transport of fish from Waterford would become operative in the immediate future. The arrangements would have the effect of reducing transport charges on consignments to Billingsgate Fish Market, London and should do much to encourage and develop our export trade in fish.

ATTENDANCE OF VE TEACHERS AT SPECIAL COURSE

Permission But No Money

At the monthly meeting of the County Waterford Vocational Education Committee held in Dungarvan on Tuesday last, the CEO Mr. D. Cullinan read a letter from the Department regarding the holding of a refresher science course for science and rural science teachers to be held in Dublin next month. The Department stated that the Committee to refund the cost of the course to any teacher who would attend the course.

The CEO said the Committee had two Rural Science teachers and it would cost about £18 to send them to the course. While the course would undoubtedly be an excellent one said the CEO and one that the teachers should attend in order to keep abreast of the times, it cannot recommend their attendance as the Committee has not the kind of money needed.

Mr. T. O'Faolain said that the teachers should be given every facility in this regard. Mr. N. Walsh—But if we haven't got the money we can't send them and that's all about it. The CEO stated that he estimated that the Committee would have a credit balance of about £23 at the end of the financial year but even that was doubtful.

Mr. J. Fahy said that it was indeed a pity that the teachers could not attend such a course. Replying to a question by Professor M. O'Hara the CEO said that the teachers could go at their own expense if they wished. When Mr. O'Faolain suggested sending one teacher Mr. Walsh disagreed, stating that the Committee could not make fish of one ear while the other was in the air.

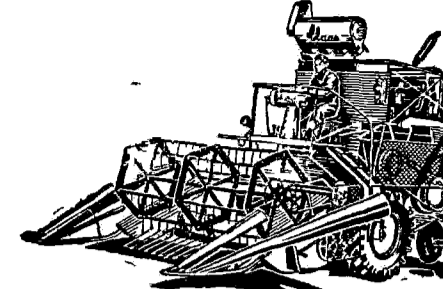
