## BEHIND THE SPOTLIGHT

With PENSMAN

**INTERESTING FIGURES AND FACTS**  
I had reason to be directly affected by the Census. I am a member of the Capital Statistics Office in Dublin. I read the latest census returns. The only statement that the most interesting feature of the 1956 census was the population of the country was 2,688,264. The birth rate was 21 per 1,000 of the population and the death rate 17 per 1,000.

Let me cite the example of Holland, a country the size of Munster, with its low natural resources and with its colonies all lost from the ruins of war, occupation and poverty. In these last years it has achieved a national income per head of 11,000 and reduced the National Debt. Between 1949 and 1956 the investment in industry and agriculture was no less than 2,800,000,000. This investment coming in the main out of State funds, but from private enterprise.

The public authorities have spread the taxation and outlay. If they spent well and wisely this might be acceptable. But do they always spend the money on the right things? Does the nation get good value for what they spend?

**S. Dominant**  
This country is committed by its Constitution to private enterprise. But actually, where outside the Communist countries, does not exist a State dominant part in the national economy. Thus the share of the gross national income spent here by the Government is greater than the proportion of State funds in the European countries, not excluding near-Socialist Sweden. Moreover, the State-owned enterprises, by our State-owned and State-operated companies like the E.S.B., C.I.E., Bord na Móna, etc., are distinguished from what the State or local council manages directly, is also higher than for the corresponding concerns in any of these countries.

**MORE MONEY NEEDED TO PAY RATE COLLECTORS**

**Council Gets Legal Advice**

Because of a cut of £1,200 in last year's estimate a number of rate collectors could not be paid for the past year as the collectors are usually accustomed to this. This was pointed out at a meeting of the Dungarvan Council on Monday when Mr. J. J. O'Leary, County Accountant, told the members that an excess expenditure of £1,200 would have to be approved to allow the payments to be made. Mr. T. Lannon said that this was not much point in cutting the estimates by £1,200 if it had to be put on now.

The Chairman, Mr. M. Morrissey, said that the Council could not legally cut the poundage for the past year as the collectors had not been informed in time.

The Secretary, Mr. J. G. Dowling, told Mr. Curran that the collectors had got legal advice on the matter.

Mr. Curran said that does it propose that this money be not approved and if they wish let them challenge the Council's estimate. I'm not against the collectors but the Council will have to make a stand in this matter. Finally it was agreed to obtain legal opinion as to the Council's obligations and rights.

**MONEY MUST BE PAID**

At last Monday's Estimates Meeting of the Council the Chairman said that the Council's legal advisers, Mr. M. M. Halley, was present.

Mr. Halley then told the Council that it would not be possible to implement the cut for the past year. For the coming year a revised scheme was proposed by the Manager on the request of the Council and this could then be put to the Council. It was sanctioned by the Minister.

Mr. Halley then suggested that the Council might select three members who with a representative from the Council could meet the Manager to evolve a scheme whereby poundage charges could be stabilised.

Mr. Lannon asked for particulars of the present salaries paid to collectors.

The Chairman said that he did not think the names and salaries should be given in public. It was not fair publicity for the Council to give it in the paper.
