BOVINE T.B. ERADICATION SCHEME

Press Interview Protest By Agricultural Committee Members

At the last meeting of the County Waterford Committee of Agriculture in Dungarvan some members criticised the action of the C.A.O., Mr. P. Conroy, in giving an interview to a columnist on the Dungarvan Leader in relation to remarks at the previous meeting concerning the Bovine T.B. Eradication Scheme. One member went so far as to state that the press reports on this matter were inaccurate. The matter was referred to by Mr. W. Dever who stated that he wished to make a protest against the interview given by the C.A.O. to the columnist in a discussion which had taken place at the previous meeting of the Committee. It was well-known that all members of the Committee were in favour of the Bovine T.B. Eradication Scheme and that the press reports were in fact a distortion of the views of the C.A.O. Mr. Dever stated that he had taken objection to the scheme and that the Bovine T.B. Eradication Scheme had been offered by the Minister on condition that it would be accepted and participated in by a majority of herd-owners in the County. In the interview he had given he had set out the Minister's statement on the importance of the scheme and for words and phrases which were a distortion of what she had said at the meeting.
