STEEP INCREASE IN DUNGARVAN RATES Council Adopts Full Estimate

Dungarvan Urban Council at its annual estimates meeting last Friday night struck a rate of 44 1/2d, the full amount, recommended by Mr. McCarthy, the Chairman. The rate is an increase of 1 1/2d on last year's figure.

LISMORE AND CAPPOQUIN COW-TESTING ASSOCIATION

The Annual General Meeting of the Lismore and Cappoquin Cow-Testing Association was held in the Lismore Hotel on Friday, March 20th, 1959. A large number of members were present. Also in attendance was Mr. M. J. Droney, Inspector, Department of Agriculture.

The report on the year's work of the Association was read by Miss B. Canning, Supervisor as follows: Chairman, Ladies and Gentlemen, I wish to submit for your consideration my report on the work of the Association for the year 1958. The Association consists of 20 members who have completed 322 cows. Of these completed records are available for 251 cows. The average yield of milk and butter-fat for the completed cows was 6,654 lbs. milk and 1,290 lbs. butter-fat. Average test 3.91 per cent. Valuing butter-fat at 4. per lb. and separating milk at 2d. per lb., the value of the production of the completed cows was £367 7s. 4d. per cow.

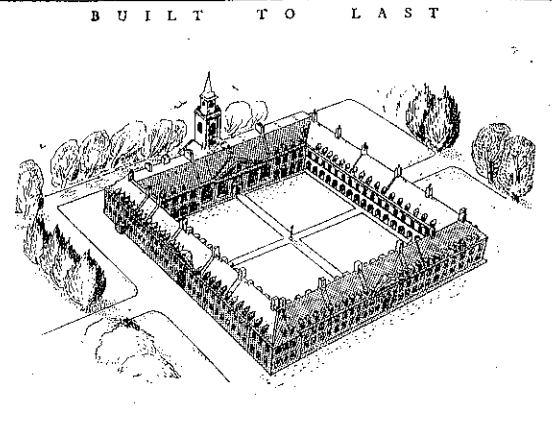

The Royal Hospital, Kilmalnam, one of Dublin's oldest public buildings was commenced in 1680, as a hospital for old soldiers. Kilmalnam derives its name from 'Maignend's Church', built on this site in early times. Designed by Sir William Robinson, Surveyor General of Ireland, the Hospital is an edifice of two stories in the form of a quadrangle, with a graceful tower rising from one facade. The most noteworthy part is the spacious and well-proportioned hall, considered by many to be the finest interior in Dublin. The Chapel, which contains the only surviving remains of the former Priory, is remarkable for its splendid wood carving, and a magnificent stucco ceiling is a feature of great interest. In recent times the building was occupied by the Garda Síochána, until it was vacated in 1950 for extensive repairs.
