FATAL ACCIDENT AT AGLISH Lismore Man For Trial On Manslaughter Charge

John Edward (otherwise Ted) Bonner, a 28 year old married carpenter from Ballyfartra, Lismore, was returned for trial on a charge of manslaughter by District Justice W. P. Cahill, following a day long sitting for the taking of depositions.

The charge arose from a fatal accident on the Aglish-Villierstown road on the night of February 22nd when 18 years old Patrick Davis of Aglish was killed by a car driven by the accused.

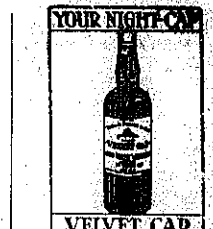
Dr. D. Coughlan, State Solicitor, prosecutor and John Edward Bonner, the accused, were in court for the taking of depositions. The witness was a number of charges such as dangerous driving, and driving without insurance, but the main charge against the accused was one of manslaughter. He told the court that at 12.30 p.m. on Sunday night, 22nd February, Bonner drove a powerful car at a very high speed along the road between Villierstown and Aglish. It was a bright moonlight night and the road was very dark. The car crashed into a ditch and the driver was killed. The car was found to be carrying 46 lbs. of petrol. Walter Downing, Droine, Villierstown, a farm labourer aged 40 years stated that on the night of February 22nd from 7.30 up to about 9 o'clock he was with the last witness and also with the late Patrick Davis and William Downing. He went home with James Ronayne and while they were with Pat Davis he was in good health and sober.

Like A Shot From A Gun William Downing, Aglish, who was with the deceased at the time of the accident gave a graphic description of what occurred. He stated: "I am a forestry worker aged 21 years. On Sunday, 22nd February, I met the late Pat Davis after depositions in Aglish. We walked to Villierstown and on the way Ted Bonner's car passed us. It was then about 8.20 p.m. I had seen the car drive

Site For Kilmathomas Dispensary

When the Secretary Mr. J. A. Hynds, told members of the Waterford Board of Assistance at their monthly meeting in Dungarvan on Tuesday last that the price asked for a quarter acre site for a dispensary at Kilmathomas was £190, Mr. Frank Roche said that it was a "bit thick" to be looking for such a price.

The matter had been adjourned from a previous meeting to await the decision of the County Council who were going to share the site for the erection of a Fire Station with the Board. The Secretary said that he had heard nothing from the County Council in the meantime.

Mr. Roche said that the owner of the site seemingly wanted to make a fortune. If the price asked was reasonable he would not oppose it, but there was no doubt that the owner thought he was selling it to people who could pay.

The Secretary said that the Board could get other sites, but without sewerage or water. Both these were available in the case of the site offered.

It was agreed on the suggestion of Mr. T. Lannon, Chairman, to instruct the officials of the Board to negotiate with the owner and report to the next meeting.

Serious Allegation At Board Meeting

This is a very serious complaint and one that should be investigated at once, said Mr. T. Lannon, Chairman, at the monthly meeting of the Waterford Board of Assistance in Dungarvan on Tuesday.

Mr. Curran said that he should have a distinct objection to such a practice. The Board decided that an investigation of the complaint be carried out by the Chairman and Secretary of the Board before the next meeting.
