## THE GRABBING HAND FROM DUBLIN

### Co. Council Votes Increases For Engineers

Waterford County Council at their evening meeting in Dungarvan last week decided by 12 votes to 3, with 3 not voting to raise the salary scale for the Chief Assistant County Engineer, and six Assistant County Engineers as from 1st April, 1959. The new scale for the Chief Assistant steps up his salary by £26 a year to £1,190 by increments of £35 to £1,400, while the other Assistants get an increase of £28 a year on the new scale of £950 by increments of £27 10s to £1,200 a year plus a 5 per cent bonus on the new scale.

When the matter was reached on the agenda it was late in the evening and several members suggested that it be deferred until the next meeting, but the Deputy Chairman, Mr. S. Deegan, stated that the new scales had already been approved in other counties, and urged the Council to do the same.

The Chairman, Mr. Michael Morrissey, supported the Manager's suggestion, and pointed out the excellent engineering staff which the Council had.

Mr. T. Lannon—the poor people of the county won't be able to pay all they're being asked for.

The County Engineer, Mr. J. O'Connell, said that the present scale had been arrived at after negotiations last year between the Engineers' Association, the Department of Local Government, and the Department of Public Works.

Mr. Lannon remarked: "Soon there will be nobody in the county only those who are in the Government—what a Local Authorities."

Mr. Deegan said that the £200 to be paid by way of increases about £200 would go to the county only those who are in the Government—what a Local Authorities."

Mr. Lannon—Sure when you're going to give it all, why don't you give it to them tax free as well!

Mr. Foran—Go £200 out of the £200 will go back up to the great department in Dublin. It's a blooming scandal to see the ratpayers mulcted like this. We have no compensation at all. Those people up in Dublin take from us with one hand—take a goodly share of our money—and then they give us with the other. It's a horrible situation to be living in. I don't think men who are already well paid.

The Chairman proposed, and Mr. J. Quirk, seconded, a resolution that the new scale of salaries be approved.

Mr. Lannon proposed an amendment that they be not approved and Mr. K. O'Ryan seconded this.

Mr. C. Curran stating that where matters involving big amounts of money were concerned, they should be considered only at the Council's Annual Estimates Meeting, proposed a further amendment that the matter be adjourned to the next estimates meeting.

Mr. J. Quirk, seconded this.

Mr. R. Keane said that the matter not object to the increases in the Engineers' did the work for which Consultants were now engaged. It was a terrible waste of money, he said, to see Consultants coming in now for even the smallest jobs.

The Chairman then put Mr. Lannon's amendment to the meeting, and it was defeated by 13 votes to 3, as follows:—  
For—Messrs. Curran, Lannon, O'Ryan, Quirk, Flynn, Power—(7).  
Against—Messrs. Dowling, Lannon, O'Ryan, Quirk, Flynn, Power—(3).  
Did Not Vote—Messrs. Hartly and Foran—(2).

The proposal to approve of the new scales as proposed by the Chairman was next put and this was defeated by 12 votes to 3 as follows:—  
For—Messrs. J. Butler, Hartly, Keane, Fahy, Roche, Heekin, Montayne, Kennedy, Lynch, Morrissey, Power—(12).  
Against—Messrs. Dowling, Lannon, O'Ryan—(3).  
Did Not Vote—Messrs. Foran, Curran and Quirk—(3).

When the result of this vote was announced, Mr. Lannon declared that he would not accept responsibility one way or the other and they don't come in here in future and talk about the rates.

## NEW TECHNIQUES IN SILAGE MAKING

New techniques in the making of grass silage were shown and explained at a special demonstration at the farm of Mr. G. Dempsey, Shandon, Dungarvan, on Monday last.

Mr. Michael Byrne, Agricultural Instructor, Waterford, gave a brief but very comprehensive talk on the technique of silage-making, and this was followed by further demonstrations.

The demonstration ended with a cordial vote of thanks to Mr. Con Dempsey for his co-operation in placing a field at the disposal of the Committee for the occasion.

**AMENITY OR EYE-SORE**  
Will Dungarvan's fine swimming pool remain one of the town's amenities or will it become an eye-sore. These are questions of the moment in Dungarvan. The pool was undoubtedly one of the finest in the country and was the envy of all visiting swimmers and holiday-makers. It housed wonderful gals and champion swimmers from Ireland, England, and Wales, showed their prowess in the pool, and was a source of pride to the town.

Those were the days of its greatness, but it has fallen by the wayside and when I walked along that way last week what met my eye was indeed a sorry sight. The pool that once drew unnumbered admirers to the town, now stands in a state of neglect. The water is dirty and shabby looking. Thanks to its treatment by the town's public works department, the pool has become a derelict and desolate place.

Still for all that, the young boys and girls and adolescents cling to their old love of the pool and despite the official notices they climbed over the walls and gates for a swim. And who could blame them with the weather so warm and the tide at the strand black out.

It is indeed a sad state of affairs that compels me to protest against the official action in keeping the pool closed during the recent weeks of sunshine. Red tape should have given way to a little commonsense and the pool should have been whitewashed, cleaned and opened to the public. Surely after all the people of Dungarvan pay in rates a lot on useless and unneeded for expenditure they and their children should be afforded the use of a pool which was built in more progressive times.

**MOLL GOGGIN**  
Few people there are who have visited Youghal and who have not heard of Moll Goggin's corner, but there must be many who do not know how this well-known landmark got its name. I believe there are a number of versions as to how this vantage point came to be called Moll Goggin, but the following is that most commonly accepted. In the days when Youghal was a thriving seaport, a prosperous shopkeeper named Goggin lived there. He had a daughter Mary who was affectionately known to her parents and friends as Moll. Now Moll was a comely lass who was loved by many, but her love centred solely and exclusively on a strapping young sailor lad. Her parents frowned on her choice, but nonetheless Moll spiritedly stood by her lover and in due course they were married.

However, when the honeymoon was over Moll's sailor husband had to go off in his ship and when the ship was expected to return she expressed the wish that they should both go to the spot which now bears her name. There they took a fond farewell of each other with the promise that the sailing date which she gave would be returned by her husband on a certain date when the ship was expected to return to Youghal.

Away sailed the ship and the weeks slipped by. Unknown to Moll and the people of Youghal, tragedy struck when the ship was lost with all hands. As the date for the return of the ship came round Moll kept her date and there she waited not knowing that her food husband had gone to a watery grave. From her lookout she saw the lights of a returning ship, but nothing daunted she remained convinced that her loved one would break his date. And then as the evening mist were falling she saw his coming towards her. She rushed to his open arms and raised her lips to his, but as their lips met she felt the awful truth that he was dead.

The tragedy literally broke her heart and later when she was found lying on the grass a trickle of blood from her lips told the end of the tragic love story and that Moll had gone in spirit to join her sailor boy.

Ever since, the place where her body was found has been known as Moll Goggin's corner.

## ATTEMPTED ROBBERY AT DUNGARVAN PREMISES

Man Charged At Special Court

Following an attempted robbery at the premises of A. McInerney & Sons, Ltd., Dungarvan, on last Friday night, there was a Garda raid on the Quay and Main Street areas of the town. A member of the Garda staff, residing on the premises, Mr. John Fitzgerald, raised the alarm when he heard the door being forced open at 11 p.m. Gardaí were on the scene within a short time, but the burglar escaped. An examination of the premises showed that no suspicious articles were found. The Garda continued their inquiries and there was a sequel to the raid on Saturday afternoon when a number of Gardaí under Sergeant J. E. Liddane, arrested Michael Duggan, 21, Caseyville, Dungarvan, outside a licensed premises at O'Connell Street at about 3.30 p.m. Duggan and a companion, James Mulcahy, Murphy Place, Abbey-side, resisted the Gardaí and they had to be forcibly taken to the Barracks. The incident caused much excitement in O'Connell Street.

Later Mulcahy was released but Duggan was retained and at a special court held before Mr. C. J. Murphy, P.C. at the Garda Barracks on Saturday afternoon he was charged with house-breaking and larceny at Moloney's on the previous night. He was remanded in custody to Dunderin (Co. Tipperary) Court, on Wednesday and was removed under Garda escort to Limerick jail.
