BEECHFIELD LOAN WILL BE REPAYD NEXT YEAR

Mr. T. Lannon was told by the Town Clerk, Mr. J. Howlett, at last Friday night's meeting of Dungarvan Urban Council that the loan raised to pay the damages claim of the "Beechfield" would be finally repaid in 1960.

At last week's meeting of Waterford County Council, the increases granted to the Assistant County Engineers were again referred to when Mr. T. Lannon asked whether the extra money required would have to be raised as an overexpenditure.

The Chairman, Mr. M. Morrissey, thought that an overexpenditure would be required.

Mr. Lannon—How much is the total amount involving the Harbour account which would have a debit of about 24,000 when the repayments were completed and the Council would then have to think of clearing off that.

Mr. Lannon—Surely you don't expect them to give us grants to pay the Engineer's salaries.

The Chairman said that in the motion passed at the last meeting provision was made for an overexpenditure of 21,123.

Mr. Lannon—Now there's not much point in members talking about the rates going up when they come along like this and pass 21,160 for salary increases.

Mr. Lannon—These men are already well paid and they are being paid by members here is no god, but you can be judged by your actions when you vote on issues like this.

To improve Roads at Ring The Secretary read a letter from the Department of Local Government detailing the Council of full grants for the improvement of two roads in the Ring and Helvic districts.

The amount involved was 2800 to widen and improve the road at Upper Helvic from Deelish Morrissey's to Willie Kelly's, and 2800 for the Ring Chapel road and to widen the corner there.

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New Water Scheme Not Needed

A query however, been received from the Creamery's Consultant Engineer as to the Council's charge for 1,000 gallons for water and the estimated consumption figures had also been submitted. 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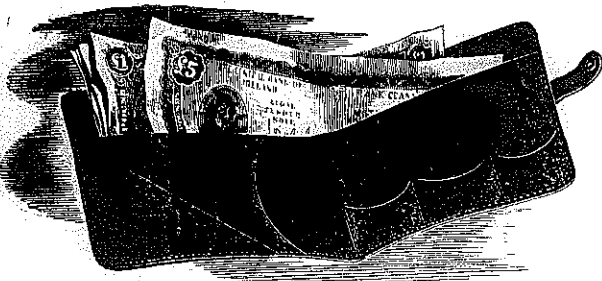

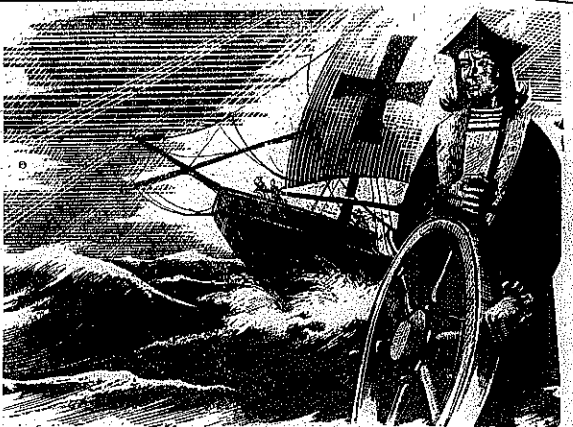
