WATER SHORTAGE
The phenomenal spell of dry weather has played havoc with the water supply system all over the country and the great drought has caused local authorities in all areas to enforce emergency measures in an effort to maintain some kind of supply to the human consumption has been cut to a minimum and in several cases residents have been warned to boil all drinking water. GREATER SUPERVISION

The paratyphoid outbreak in Dungarvan which still appears to be gaining momentum since the need for greater supervision where the marketing of milk for human consumption is concerned. There have been pat theories advanced that bad water has been the cause but it has been fairly well established that the root of the trouble in the present case stems from contaminated milk.

The source was detected and eliminated on the 19th September but as the incubation period of the fever covers a period of from seven to twenty-one days the all-clear cannot be sounded until after the 10th October and even then it is possible that there will still be an odd case here and there.

It is surprising in this age with so much stress on cleanliness and hygiene that there should be outbreaks of this kind in Dungarvan on two successive years. The Board of Health and the County Council, Mr. Charles Curran, was mild when he said that the outbreak was a "raw" one. It is a food which is considered mainly to be "raw" and it is a food which is not only for infants and children but for adults as well. In most family circles the milk is rarely absent from the table at any meal. This being the case, there is all the more reason to ensure that the milk for human consumption is subjected to every care from the moment it is taken from the cow until it is consumed. To ensure this, continual supervision is necessary and constant checking by the responsible authority is required. While such supervision should be an all-year round matter there should be extra precautions, with weekly spot checks and tests for purity, taken during the months of July, August, and September when milk goes scarce and supplies have to be supplemented from outside sources.

This is where the Health Authorities could prove of real benefit to the community as the power is theirs to carry out these tests under the Food & Hygiene regulations. It is very fine to have an organization which will go around taking tests and carrying out certain precautions after an outbreak has occurred. Would it not be better to carry out tests before such an outbreak could occur and so avoid a lot of heartbreak and worry for the community and save the public purse a great deal of expense. The other thing smacks very much of closing the doors when the horse has gone.
