## DEISE HURLERS ARE CHAMPIONS OF IRELAND

### WATERFORD MAKE NO MISTAKE IN SECOND CLASH WITH NORESIDERS

When the tumult and the cheering of the Deise supporters that made the welkin ring in stand-flanked Croke Park at the conclusion of last Sunday's incident-packed All-Ireland replay had died down and as jubilant Waterford followers shouldered our heroic hurlers across the field on which they had just well and truly vanquished their Kilkenny opponents, the thoughts of the more sober ones among the huge gathering must have bridged the two-year span of memory to that other bleak hurling day in September '57 in which our men had also scored three goals and twelve points and yet conceded a one-point victory to the self-same opponents. But there were no doubts this time, only the conviction that our team was truly the best in Ireland and the satisfaction that an extended and most trying championship campaign and been climaxed with the crown of final victory.

It is difficult to describe the first reactions after referee Gerry Fitzgerald blew full time. Croke Park erupted in a mass of blue and white favours, as caps and flags waved, horns and rattlers sounded and the already hoarse thousands who had travelled up for the game allowed the floodgates of their pent up feelings to overflow. Groups of excited Deise men, women and children embraced and congratulated each other on the stands while across the pitch from the Cusack stand side flowed a river of blue and white as cheering, flag-waving Waterfordians mingled with their hurling heroes and further cheering echoed through the Park as team Captain, 22-year-old Frankie Walsh, received the McCarthy Cup from G.A.A. President, Dr. J. Stuart. Returning thanks, after Dr. Stuart congratulated the Waterford hurlers on their magnificent display, Frank Walsh on behalf of his team mates re-echoed the feelings of triumph that swelled in the breasts of all Deise followers when he said "we hope to be back again."

This has been a great year for the Gaelic Athletic Association as it marks the diamond jubilee of its foundation. It will be recalled as the year in which the new Hogan stand was opened and in the history of the names it will be recalled as the year in which Waterford flashed through the Munster Championship, making all opposition look poor. Our Deise hurlers piloted Galway in the opening round; they caused consternation by deterring champions, Tipperary, by a one-goal score, in the semi-final and they showed their real merit as champions when they overcame the Rebel County hurlers in the provincial decider at Thurles. This put us into the final in which our opponents turned out to be old rivals and again we experienced a new sensation when our men turned the tables on the Noreiders and snatched the game out of the jaws of defeat. How ironic it would have been had Seamus Power's hammer stroke not found the net that day. Last Sunday's replay showed how truly superior Waterford were when they struck proper form. To quote Seamus Power's own words after Sunday's victory: "There was no real difference between this game and the draw game. We proved that our draw on the last day which was not a fluke and that we had it in us to beat Kilkenny. It was a vindication of the Deise team which lost so narrowly and gave us the revenge which we wanted badly." The lessons they learned in the drawn game were put to real test on Sunday. They dictated the trend of events and they gave us a display in hurling and a heroic endeavour to which Kilkenny had no answer.

**Superbly Fit**  
After a start which gave us all the blues, Waterford settled down and from there to the end there was no slackening of pace. No complacent acceptance of victory as in the fatal final of '57 and no technical errors as in the drawn game of a month ago. Kilkenny were quite overpowered by the incredibly sustained effort of a superbly fit team who combined with their superb physical fitness their wonderful ability to meet all the requirements of a testing hour. As an All-Ireland final the match can take its place with some of the greatest in the past. It opened with twelve minutes of heartache as Kilkenny raced to a 1-4 to 0-4 lead. In this period Kilkenny displayed supreme confidence, while Waterford looked as if they were going to be swamped. But sure it was only a period of growing pains while our men were getting their stride. When Mick Flannelly dashed the ball past Ollie Walsh in the 14th minute, Waterford assumed their real stature and took on the mantle of greatness which they wore like the true champions they are for the remainder of the game. In the second half, having led 2-5 to 1-8 at the interval, the Deise men drew on seemingly inexhaustible stores of energy

#### REPLAY RECORD

The attendance of 72,000 at Croke Park on Sunday was the third highest for an All-Ireland senior hurling final. There were 24,000 people at the Cork v. Wexford game in 1957 and 25,000 saw the same counties two years later. Sunday's crowd does however set a record in either hurling or football for a replay.

With a firm defence in front of him Power gave a superb display which put him on a par with the great players of the past. He was not guilty of a single error of judgement for the hour. In the ninth minute he provided us with one of the most thrilling memories of the game when he kicked a full length shot from Fleming with his hand. Outside the team showed itself as perfectly balanced and unselfish side. Each player went about his task with a determination which was wonderful. In the third quarter of the game when Kilkenny put on the pressure our defence yielded not an inch. Dwyer, Tom O'Connell and Dick Carroll the trio who provided many of our best moments of the month ago, Joe Harney especially vindicated his reputation by the manner in which he completely outplayed O'Connell and the extent to which he outplayed O'Connell raised not even a shadow to the extent of the other players. **Firm Defenders, Superb Goals**  
In the interim since the drawn game, main topic of conversation has been our full-back line. Had these men who had been so outpoken in allowing the Kilkenny forwards to crowd on top of goalie Ned Power in the drawn game, learned their lesson? Could they succeed in holding the wily Noreiders at bay on this occasion? Could our full-forward line operate to more effect against the Walsh and Maher? These were the questions of the hour. Our doubts began to rise in these opening passages as the Kilkenny forwards swarmed in time and again but once this initial period of nervousness was over, our backs backed to their task and sure it was Kilkenny who had to abandon their attempts to pass through goal. Austin Flynn and John Barron displayed the gritting which we longed for in the drawn game and which makes any forward think twice before trying to break through the wings and their non-stop hurling on the ground and in the air left the Kilkenny backs to be continually split with well placed crosses. Mick Flannelly completely justified his recall as in the eighth minute he gave our goal in the first quarter and his goal in the 14th minute was a gem of a score. The move, like so many others during the hour, was started by Tom Cunnigham who sent the ball to Frank Walsh, which passed to Tom Cheasty and the water transferred. The ensuing fight whizzer Flannelly who sent a great drive to the left corner of the net. Flannelly was ever a thorn in the side of the Kilkenny defence which he continually split with well placed crosses.
