FEVER OUTBREAK TO BE PROBED

Call For Joint Meeting of Health Authorities

This matter should not be lightly passed over by just saying that the source has been found and left there then, said Mr. T. A. Kyne, T.D., at last Monday's meeting of the Waterford Board of Assistant Health Authorities at which the outbreak of paratyphoid fever at Abbeyside, was discussed. The outcome of the discussion was a call for a joint meeting between the Board and County Council, both Health Authorities dealing with the matter, to be held in Dungarvan on Monday next.

At the last meeting of the Board, the Chairman, Mr. Charles Curran, asked for a full report from the County Medical Officer as to the cause of the epidemic and the steps being taken to prevent a recurrence. On Monday, the Secretary, Mr. J. A. Hynes, told the Chairman that he had received a letter from the Secretary of the County Council forwarding copy of a statement from the County Medical Officer which had been issued and published in the local papers.

Mr. T. A. Kyne said that he would like to know if, when the outbreak was first detected, the Health Authorities took any milk samples from the houses where people were infected and whether any consideration was given to inoculating the people with the vaccine.

Mr. Curran, Chairman, said that the letter read by the Secretary was tantamount to ignoring the Board's request. While he knew the County Council had thought out of commission courtesy in the circumstances that was not the source of the outbreak.

The Minister for Health's report of the inquiry into the circumstances of the death of Mrs. Anastasia Dooley, Ballinacorney, Co. Wick, which occurred at Arkkeen General Hospital, on September 16, 1958, was discussed at the Board of Assistance in Dungarvan. The report published after last month's meeting stated that there had been an avoidable delay of almost 24 hours in the removal of Mrs. Dooley by ambulance to hospital and that it indicated to the Minister a certain slackness in the administration. Observations on the matter as made by the R.M.S., Dr. F. L. Corrigan, published after the meeting, were also referred to.
