Doctors Report On Paratyphoid  
Outbreak  
Biggest Epidemic in 25 Years  
Contaminated Milk Supply  
Blamed

THERE was a full scale discussion on the paratyphoid outbreak which swept through Abbeyside during September and October at the quarterly meeting of Waterford County Council held in Dunganarvan on Monday. In the course of the discussion a full report on the epidemic from the County Medical Officer, Dr. M. O'Farrell, was read, and while this report was accepted by all the members as comprehensive and adequate, several members expressed the view that it should have been released sooner. The report laid the blame for the outbreak on a contaminated milk supply.

At the outset the Chairman, Mr. M. Morrissey, referred to the request from the Board of Assistance for a joint meeting with the Council to discuss the outbreak and said that he felt that he had no power to call such a meeting and consequently had not done so.

Mr. T. A. Kynne, T.D., said that it was an awful state of affairs that the Board of Assistance which had to face the bill for the treatment of the paratyphoid cases was not an official one. 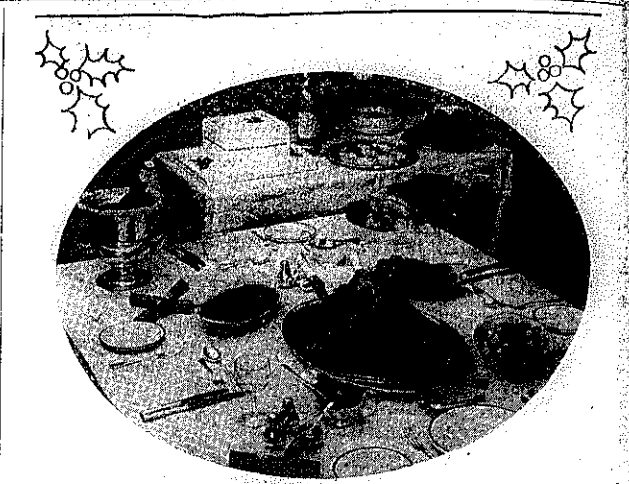

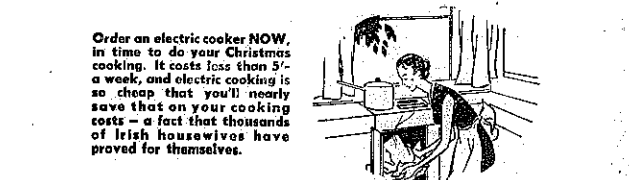
**No Cost To Ratepayers**
