### TENANT PURCHASE SCHEME

Dungarvan Council have adopted a purchase scheme for the tenants of their various schemes under which houses can be purchased for sums varying from £250 to £1,250. The scheme is confined to tenants only and it is to be hoped that it will meet with the success it deserves. When queries were made a few years ago in regard to a similar scheme the response was that the failure on that occasion was due to advice given to tenants by council elements on the Council. Houses in the Congress Villas area will be available at from £250 to £300 and the prices for other houses are graded upwards, the highest values being placed on the Council's two later schemes. Murphy Place, Abbeyside where some houses are priced at £1,100 and Casey's at £1,250.

## MORE HOUSES NEEDED IN CAPPOQUIN

Council Disagrees With Doctors' Recommendation

A recommendation from Dr. O'Farrell, County Medical Officer, that no further houses be built at O'Donoghue Terrace, Cappoquin, as requested by Mr. Norman Walsh, was rejected by the Waterford County Council at their meeting in Dungarvan last Monday.

Reporting on the request as made by Mr. Walsh, the County Secretary, Mr. J. G. Dowling, said that in reply to an advertisement for tenancies for new houses at O'Donoghue Terrace only four applications were received. Dr. O'Farrell stated that none of these was of any urgency and as the normal turnover of vacant houses in the town should meet current demands he did not recommend that any new houses be built.

### Rate Collector's Application Leads To Fiery Discussion

### Member Challenges Chairman: Trying To Stifle Views

An application from Rate Collector J. Edmund McCarthy, Dungarvan, for an extension of his collecting district, sparked off a fiery discussion at the County Council meeting in Dungarvan on Monday last. Mr. J. G. Dowling, County Secretary, reported that the Council had decided by 11 votes to 5, to adjourn the application until next April.

Mr. J. Quirke said that he would not be in favour of giving an increase of £277 as requested by the collector. He said that there would be a number of other jobs for young men who would be asked to get them. They are fine jobs and it is unfair to take any portion and give it to a person who already has a job. With unemployment as it is and people leaving night after night from the station ever there going to England looking for work, it would be a scandalous state of affairs.

Mr. T. A. Kynne, T.D., who proposed that the request be granted, said that he had been approached by Mr. McCarthy on the matter and told him to make his request in writing to the Council. As the request would be made for five extra houses he pointed out that when a house at this terrace became vacant recently there were certainly more than four applicants for it.

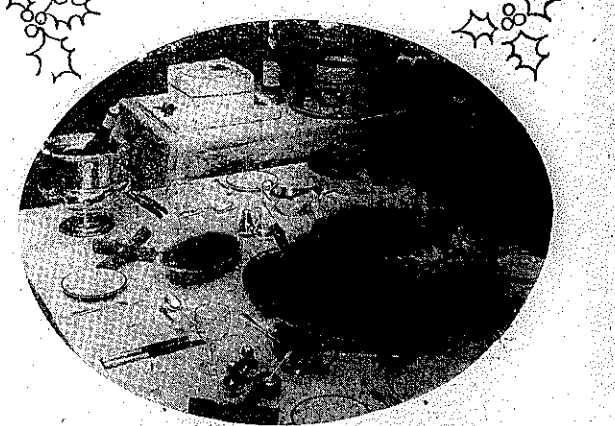

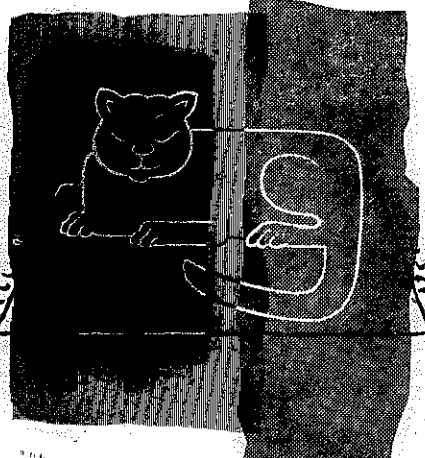
