BEHIND THE SPOTLIGHT

—WILL PENSMAN

MINISTER WAS IMPRESSED. A top level conference dealing with the proposed factory for Lismore was held at Lismore House, Dublin, last week.

The conference with the Minister for Industry & Commerce, Mr. J. Lynch, was arranged by Mr. Sean O'Connell, ex-Minister for Posts & Telegraphs, who is the promoter of the factory. The Minister and four of the promoters including the chairman, Mr. J. J. O'Connell, were present.

The Minister was very much impressed by the case put forward by the promoters for the allocation of a State grant towards the cost of the proposed factory but made it clear that before arriving at any decision he would have to consult with his advisers in An Foras Tionnaisc.

The project seems to have all the qualifications needed by the promoters, local capital, local raw material, sound technical advisers and a competent management for the operation of the proposed factory. It is to be situated in an economically depressed area. The project is intended exclusively for export to a country where more than adequate market for it is assured for years to come.

The people of West Waterford and indeed of the entire county are awaiting anxiously for the Minister's favourable decision.

THE FORTNIGHTLY meeting of the Dungarvan Urban Council on last Friday night was a success. The only item of any weight on the agenda was the proposed extension of the sewerage system to the borois located at the site of the old Gite factory at Ballinacorney. The Town Clerk, Mr. J. J. O'Connell, reported that the sewerage system had been satisfactorily completed.

THE POSITION now is that the matter is to be referred to the Council's Consulting Engineer to prepare a scheme. This is estimated to cost £250,000. It is expected that something like £100,000 will be required for the present discussions and negotiations in the course of the coming year.

With regard to the water works at Deelish which are only twenty years in existence, I understand that the County Council would be interested in taking these over as a source to supply the residents of Ballinacorney and others living adjacent to the Urban boundary on that side of the town. The purchase of these works would help in some degree to cushion the impact on the rates which the new Urban scheme will undoubtedly have.

A TREAT FOR CELLI FANS—Self donors who will support the Comhaltas Ceoltoiri Ceili at the Town Hall, Dungarvan, on next Sunday night have a treat in store for them. It is the Clancy Brothers Ceili Band from Tyrone which is building up a reputation as one of Ireland's outstanding exponents of Irish dance music.

This is the first occasion on which the band has been so far South, but Tom Mooney, a member of the Committee and an expert on ceili music himself, assured me that the Clancy Brothers are a combination out of the top drawer. I feel sure that lovers of ceili music and Irish dancing in the area will not allow the opportunity of hearing them pass by. Pat Clancy, who leads the band, will be present.

COUNTY COUNCIL MAKING NO EFFORT TO KEEP DOWN RATES

Maintenance Of Additional Road Mileage

When Waterford County Council were considering motions to declare five new roads to be public roads of a total length of 2 1/2 miles at last week's adjourned quarterly meeting in Dungarvan a member stood up and charged the Council with making no attempt to keep down the rates. He was Mr. Tom Quirk who said that the present was the time to keep down the rates and not the time to increase them. "There are members here," he said, "and if you proposed a resolution to build a road you've got a second. I'm sure."

Mr. Frank Roche first set the ball rolling when he remarked that he believed the members were not being fair when they set the estimates for next year. "This is the wrong time to be considering these proposals," he said, and added, "there will be no roads meetings held soon and these are the places where these things should be brought up. From what I know we will be very small such when we before the next next June. There will be a big increase in expenditure when all these come to be ratified."

Quirk then made the statement referred to, and Mr. Roche replied that while he agreed with what Mr. Roche and Mr. Quirk had said, the rates payers living on bad roads would have to be considered too. He said that people who had cars were being constantly damaged over the bad roads they had to travel on while children could not go to school. These people were entitled to some consideration as they were not getting anything in return for what they were paying.

Mr. Roche said that he would maintain the roads as already have and we're not doing that, before the County Council meeting. Waste Of State Grants

Mr. J. Walsh said that if the County Council resolved they could take their courage in their hands and save the State grants available for the roads. He said that they should see that these were not used where possible but where they were necessary. He said that he would be glad to see the Council take this over.

That, he said, should be the case in all cases where all these roads are concerned as it was a waste of State grants if they did not.

Mr. J. D. Hally, County Engineer, suggested that the roads in question be left over until the roads estimates Committees met and all the costs were before them. They could then decide what to do or the people concerned could apply to the Department for a grant to put the roads in proper repair before the County Council meet.

Mr. J. Butler agreed that these would be better if all the costs were before the Council.

Finally the Council decided to deal with each of the roads concerned separately.
