 What then has caused this new danger to these two voluntary hospitals in Waterford and the preferential treatment being granted to patients who enter the County Hospital with its new maternity unit at Ardkeen. Patients of the lower income group and expectant mothers of the middle income group have to pay 10/- a day if they go to the Infirmary or Ardkeen. The Health Act 1948 allowed for a choice of doctor and hospital; but as far as patients in Waterford are concerned the choice is purely theoretical for those who live on a budget, and they include most of the middle income group. The Health Act 1948 will force them into Ardkeen whether they like it or not in order to save 23 10s. per week. To say least it is peculiar that Waterford Maternity Hospital which received over £31,000 from the State and which has already been recognised by the Minister of Health as well-run and fully equipped should now find competition from another hospital also built, equipped and maintained by the State and within a couple of miles of it. It would appear that the Ardkeen has set in motion an unfair rivalry—a rivalry that must result sooner or later in serious loss to those concerned and even to the general public.
