## Waterford County Council New Salary Scale Approved For Health Inspectors

**Thin Edge Of Wedge For Further Increases**

By 9 votes to 6, Waterford County Council at their special meeting last week approved a revised salary scale for the Council's three Health Inspectors. The amendment was proposed by Mr. J. O'Donoghue, Mr. P. Walsh, Dungarvan, and Mr. G. McCabe, Waterford. The scale will increase the starting salary by £29 and the maximum by £39 a year (€47 to €68). The amounts are inclusive.
