A PROGRAMME FOR ARMORE

Suggestions for the future development of Armore as a tourist and holiday resort have reached me via the Ardmore correspondent of this paper from Mr. E. Curran, a native of St. Declan's town now resident in Dublin. ## ROADS ESTIMATES UP BY £13,337

Waterford County Council at a special meeting in Dungarvan last night approved the estimates for the Annual Road Works Scheme for the coming year as submitted by Mr. J. D. Hynes, County Engineer. The scheme provided for a net expenditure of £13,337, an increase of £13,337 or approximately 10 per cent on the £12,000 estimated for 1959. ## Waterford Assistance Board Adjoins Colossal Estimate

**Expenditure Totals £388,213**

In a further effort to solve the crisis about a contribution to the County and City Infirmary, Waterford Board of Assistance adjourned last night to consider the colossal estimate of £388,213 for the coming year. The estimate, which was presented by the Board's Finance Committee, shows a total expenditure of £388,213, an increase of £13,337 on the £374,876 estimated for 1959.
