**Heated Exchanges Mark Rate Collection Discussion**

Heated exchanges in which reference was made to tick-tacking, intimidation and alleged statements by some rate collectors directed against the office system of collection, marked a fiery discussion on an application by a Rate Collector for an extension of his area at the close of the monthly meeting of Waterford County Council held in Dungarvan last Monday.

The application came from Rate Collector, Mr. J. Bernard McCarthy, Abbeysteele, who asked that the Clonon area of the Dungarvan district be added to his area. The application first came before the Council last November when Mr. McCarthy stated that the income from his present area (Tramore) was not sufficient to allow him to marry. At that meeting the County Accountant, Mr. F. J. O'Leary, told the members that Mr. McCarthy's maximum annual poundage was £217 from an additional £30 for work on abatement forms and registers. The Council at the time decided by 11 votes to 5 to adjourn the matter until the 11th of the April meeting when the rate for the office collection system was to be discussed. The rate would be completed and they would be in a better position to judge its success or failure.
