**THE ENIGMATIC JAMES  
CONNOLLY**

On Easter Monday, April 23, 1916, the Irish Republican Army took over the G.P.O., Dublin, and the following day they opened the gauntlet to the might of the British Empire. In command of the headquarters of the Irish Republican Army was the most celebrated leader of the Great Rising, James Connolly, who settled in the United States in 1903 returned to Dublin in 1910, and the following year took up permanent residence in Belfast where he became one of the great leaders of the out-  
break of the Great War in 1914 had a marked effect on him. It was then that he determined to attempt to establish a republic in Ireland as an independent republic and with this view he commenced negotiations with other persons and bodies having the same object in view.

Connolly had no illusions about the prospects of the rising. One of Connolly's closest friends, William O'Brien, recalls "as we parted on the night of Easter Monday, 1916, he whispered to me: 'We are going to be slaughtered.' When I asked: 'Is there no hope?' he replied: 'None whatever. I am a Communist and I know that I shall be more or less satisfied.'

James Connolly was a low-sized stoutly built man with a prominent nose and a prominent chin. He was a native of Edinburgh where the future leader was born in 1858. The father, a contractor who sought all means at his disposal to remove injustices and rights wronged, died as he had lived—fighting.

Much of the history of that heroic and wonderful period is contained in the latter chapters of Connolly's life story. From October 1914 he went to London with plans for carrying out the decision he had made on the eve of the outbreak of war. As Commandant he trained and drilled the Citizen Army and turned it into a real fighting force. He was in the Army headquarters at Liberty Hall, which became a centre of instruction and activity. **Councillors Condemn Delay  
In Cottage Building Scheme**

Main Responsibility Rests  
With Department

That the Department of Local Government were mainly responsible for the delay in the cottage building scheme in Dungarvan since 1926 onwards was stated in the course of a discussion at last week's monthly meeting of Waterford County Council in which members complained about the delay in providing cottages for applicants who had applied as long ago as 1921.

Mr. John Fahy complained that for that time he was waiting a notice of motion, which he had taken a lot of trouble in drafting, was not included in the agenda. He protested against its omission as it was an important motion dealing with the building of rural cottages. In his area the housing conditions of a lot of people were very bad and last January he had interviewed the Minister for Local Government about the matter and blamed him for holding up the building scheme.

Mr. John Fahy, the Minister said that it was the County Council who were responsible and he asked me to push the matter at this end. That was the reason why I prepared a motion and resolution and sent it in but it has not been put on the agenda. I think there is something more in it than that it slipped the Secretary's mind.

Fahy went on to give details of the housing conditions of some families in his area. One man with his wife and eleven children lived in a projected house with one room and a kitchen, which was ready to be built at any time. Another family had to go into a tenement and break up a vacant condemned house, while two families lived in another house which was described as "awful conditions."

**USELESS BODY**

Mr. J. G. Dowling, Secretary, stated that there had been no ulterior motive in omitting the motion from the agenda. It must have got mislaid accidentally.

On the proposal of Mr. N. Walsh seconded by Mr. M. Harvy, the Council agreed to adopt the recommendation of the County Engineer to negotiate the purchase of a site at Barrack Street, Cappoquin, owned by the State.

The invitation had come from the Waterfordmen's Association in their county, who had been selected to represent the G.A.A. of the United States on May 22 and 23 at the Gaelic Park, New York.

The approval of Congress was almost unanimous, only two Galway delegates and one from Leamington voting against it.

Mr. Pat Fenning, Chairman of Waterford County Board, who was chief spokesman for the Waterford delegates, said that when the County Board requested to come to New York by the Waterfordmen's Association, the County Board of the G.A.A. of the United States was raised at the Central Council meeting in their county, who had been selected to attend a special scholarship course on diet and nutrition organized by the Flour Millers' Association in Dublin and at Antrim.


