Increases For Doctors, Nurses, Officials and Staff

Doctors, Nurses, Officials, and staff employed in offices and hospitals of the Waterford Board of Assistance, are to be paid increases ranging from 7/6 to £2 per week following a meeting of the Board in Dungarvan last Monday at which the increases were approved, subject to sanction.

Board Approves Expenditure Of Additional £10,000

The matter arose from applications received by the various Unions representing the applicants and Mr. J. A. Hynes, Secretary, said that based on the recent Civil Service award of 8 per cent on the first £400 and 5 per cent on the balance, the total of the increases in a full year would come to £10,840. Provision has been made in the annual estimate passed by the Board last month for the payment of that amount.

Mr. T. Galloway, who proposed that the increases be granted, said that there had been great discontent among the ordinary workers and the nurses because they were already well paid compared with the position of road-workers and small farmers. He said that small farmers had to live on an income of £25 a week.

OLD PARISH FARMER
QUESTIONS MARE
NOMINATION
Deputation Before
Agricultural Committee

THE procedure adopted in awarding nominations to mares under the County Waterford Committee of Agriculture Scheme was questioned at a meeting of the Committee in Dungarvan last Saturday when a letter was read from an Old Parish farmer claiming that a mare exhibited by him should have been awarded a nomination.

The letter was from Mr. John O'Connell of the Old Parish, Barrowsclooge, who stated that he had a mare named "The Queen" which he had exhibited at the County Show last year.
