AFTER THE STORM
After the storm of the election and the excitement of the subsequent count, this week certainly presents a welcome respite. Not of course that there was anything very stormy or exciting about the elections. As a matter of fact the reverse was the position.

People seemed to show more ardour than ever towards the elections and only a little more was done in every two counties than in the previous two. The knowledge that the representatives elected would have very little legislative power and the fact that candidates always appear to be in the mood to do the most, whatever it is that remains that over the entire country only 54.6 per cent of the electorate went to the polls.

Some areas were worse than others and of the four, Lismore was the worst at 55.3 per cent, while only 44.5 per cent took the trouble of going out to cast their votes.

The Tramane area was next in line with 47.6 per cent. Here the percentage poll was only slightly better than Lismore with 47.6 per cent. The people of the Kilnashogue area were somewhat better at 57.7 per cent, visited the polling booths in that district.

The Dungarvan Urban Area was the best with 68.6 per cent of the electorate pulling their weights. Of course this figure was greatly helped by the poll in the Dungarvan Urban Area where 72 per cent of the voters took part in the election. It is a number of the rural areas in this area that were the worst. The percentage of those who went to the polls was very low, with only 49 per cent of those on the register turning out in some places.
