OBITUARIES Liam Uas. O Modhachain, An Rinn As briefly announced in our last issue the death of Liam Uas O Modhachain, Drum Phighlinn, An Rinn, occurred following a tragic accident on Tuesday, August 30. While assisting in pushing a car which stood over a pit in the garage at his home he accidentally overbalanced and fell in sustaining injuries from which he later succumbed.

His death in the fulness of years in such tragic circumstances has been the source of great sorrow to his family and to the region of friends not only in the locality but also in the district. Na Rinn, but throughout the Dulse and other parts of the country as well, where his name was well and popularly known.

He was manager of Comhar Cumann Na Rinn, the Co-Op Store at Ring for 40 years, and in that capacity he had acted as adviser and came in contact with virtually every resident in the district, and he was representative of An Bord Iascaigh Muintir, the local fishery board, and he was also representative of the local fishermen in his district.

On the outward side Liam was an ardent Gaelic League member from the beginning and his negotiations with another Gaelic League member, Seamus O'Connell, in 1915, led to the formation of the Gaelic League in the district. He was a member of the Gaelic League Executive and was back to the dawn of the present century. They were fast and firm friends and formed a partnership which was succeeded only by the death of Liam.

He wrote a number of little books such as "Ceasán Cartán" and translated the well-known drama "Saidhbhreas Mhíre Mhór" which brought an immense price for the local drama group a few years ago, but he was best-known for his work in the district. He was a member of the Gaelic League Executive and was back to the dawn of the present century.
