THE BRIDGE PROBLEM
Most serious news of the week was contained in the report of the Waterford County Engineer, Mr. J. D. Hally, on the present condition of the existing Youghal Bridge. A weakening of the superstructure at the two opening spans on the Waterford side of the bridge requires strengthening if the bridge is to be kept open even for traffic limited to 31 tons. This information must provide cause for concern for everyone who has to cross this bridge and until such time as the repairs have been carried out the necessity to pass over it will be accompanied by an added anxiety to get safely to the other side.

There is no doubt about it but there has been a great deal of publicity about this bridge and the creation of its replacement. It is a monument to inefficiency. It was condemned in 1939 by the late Waterford County Engineer Mr. John Bowen and since then we have had a catastrophic world war which saw entire cities devastated. In the meantime new cities have risen Phoenix-like from the ashes of the old. Huge bridges have replaced the bombed and blasted ones which spanned the Rhine, the Volga, the Vistula and the other mighty rivers of Europe. Now is on the threshold of competing outer space, but still we have the problem of Youghal Bridge.

Without doubt there is a lot in what Councillor William Foran said when the report was discussed at last Monday's meeting of Waterford County Council and when he told us that the building of this bridge had become the laughing stock of the entire country.

At the very earliest it will be in the region of another two and a half years before the new bridge is ready, and from past experience I might not be far wrong in forecasting that another year could be added to that. It is a frightful state of affairs that everything that is

BEHIND THE SPOTLIGHT

NEW ELECTORAL AREAS
When the next local elections are held in County Waterford there will be a big change in the electoral areas. Under the present scheme the County is divided into four areas but the new proposal of the County Council is to reorganise these and increase the number to five.

The areas as we know them at present are—Dungarvan, population 13,661, which elects 7 members, representing 1,949 persons per seat; Kilmacthomas, population 10,697, which elects 5 members, representing 2,139 persons per seat; Lismore, with a population of 8,248 which elects 5 members representing 1,650 persons per seat, and Tramore with a population of 12,565 which elects 6 members and which represents 2,093 persons per seat.

The overall county average for the 23 seats is 1,959.

By the new proposals bits will be taken off each of the existing areas and a new area in the north of the County will come into existence.

The result will increase the population of the Dungarvan area but will reduce the number of voters in all the others as follows—Dungarvan, 7 seats; population 14,231; average per seat 2,046. Kilmacthomas, 4 seats; population 7,903; average per seat 1,976. Tramore, population 8,600; 5 seats; average 1,720 per seat. Clonmel, population 5,522; 3 seats; average per seat 1,861.

When the proposals were discussed at this week's County Council meeting, the County Engineer, Mr. J. D. Hally, had a large scale coloured map on display which clearly showed the old areas and the outlines of the new ones.

SPEEDING ON ARDMORE STRAND
Thanks to a move by Mr. Charlie Curran, the Clonmel man who is Chairman of the County Council there is to be no more indiscriminate speeding on Ardmore strand. A by-law is to be introduced by the County Council by which a speed limit will be enforced for cars which pass along the strand.
