Mr. O'Sheehan before announcing the details of the draw on the Cambridgehire recalled thirty years of sweepstake.


Mr. O'Sheehan said that the present sweepstake was almost a record because it was not a record. This was the first time for a considerable period in which a record figure had not been reached.
