VIEWS OF OUR READERS

CONGO TROOPS AND IRISH FARMERS

Str.—In the issue of the Leader (dated November 19th, Mr. Brian Pearce, Hon. Treasurer Waterford Co. Executive N.F.A., took me to task concerning a paragraph which appeared in my "Notes of November 5th, headed "Congo Troops and Irish Farmers". In the course of his letter, Mr. Pearce states that the N.F.A. "deplores emigration which creates an ever lessening market for farm produce... there again I say that the N.F.A. are only worried by loss to themselves and are not worried about the loss to Ireland of its young men and women, and the heart-sucking tears that are the lot of the exile in a foreign land. He also bewails the fact that there is over-production. Here one could lay the blame on the co-arse system and the various committees who grow wheat and other agricultural produce on a huge scale and dump it on the market, often as regards wheat, in an unmarketable condition to the detriment of the farmer who grows say twenty or thirty acres, and who regards it in good condition. He remarks it is "like" as he prefers to call it, about the "negligent" farmer, he seems to have a knack of twisting the meaning of words. I said the farmers were always negatively to their workmen and with possible exceptions I stand over that statement. I have known farmers to put their employees on three days' notice when the wages were only 12/- per week. I would also remind Mr. Pearce that many a man did not pay the wages set out by the Agricultural Wages Board until they were forced to do so by threatened prosecution. I am fully aware that the continued use of new machinery and improved methods of farming has caused redundancy in employment of labour on the land, but then why do not the N.F.A. agitate to have an Agricultural Wages Board established in the Republic or failing this, to have the machinery assembly to take on the work given alternative employment to men rendered redundant by reason of the use of the machinery on the land.

Another matter which I would like to refer to is the early closing of the shops and the establishment of bars and restaurants at such places as the cinema. I am sure that the N.F.A. want a monopoly here too.

In conclusion, I would be very interested to hear from you on the subject of the young men between the ages of 19 to 45, with the exception of farmers who are employed in other parts of the Republic. Also the relative prices of milk, beef, potatoes, wheat, butter, in other European countries, in comparison with the prices obtained here—your sincerely,
