DOOL CLEAR WATER
County Secretaries of the N.F.A. are being brought right up to date on this important but hitherto neglected problem. A survey of the water supply in the various aspects of water supply is first sight to be a difficult task. It contains information dealing with the grants available, also lists the various schemes before starting a group scheme. The part of the Electricity Supply Board is prepared to take and the cost.

INCREASE SUMMER MILK
Milk that is not used for liquid consumption is converted into something else. This surplus milk is more to be handled in winter than in summer. 
