MOVE TO RE-OPEN DOCTORS' SALARIES QUESTION

Co. Waterford Is Out Of Step Says Mayor

When a letter from the Waterford Branch of the Irish Medical Association regarding an application by doctors and dentists employed by the Waterford Health Authority for increased salary scales came before the adjourned monthly meeting of the Authority in Dungarvan, it was decided by 9 votes to 5 to hold a full secret discussion on the matter at the March meeting.

By unanimous decision the Board turned down the application at their November meeting. The Board is to increase the salaries of the Chief Medical Officers (2) by £130 a year to £2,140, Dispensary Doctors (25) from a maximum of £945 by £205 a year to £1,150, Assistant County Surgeon (1) by £75 to £1,500, 3 Dentists at £140, and one to be increased from £1,445 to £1,550.

Mr. J. A. Hynes, Acting Secretary, said Mr. T. Lannon at that meeting that the cost of the increases if granted would total £5,250 in a full year.

The letter from Dr. P. C. Dooley, Secretary, Waterford City and County Branch of the I.M.A., read at last week's meeting of the Board, stated that it would appear from Press reports of the previous meeting that members of the Board were not fully acquainted with the history of events. It then related how applications were made by the I.M.A. to the County Managers in October and December 1959, and again in March 1960 for the following increases: dispensary doctors from £1,260 to £1,500 a year; County Surgeon (part time) from £2,000 to £2,500; Assistant do. from £1,500 to £1,750; County Surgeon (part time) from £2,000 to £2,060 and do. (full-time) from £2,250 to £2,365, with eight private beds and six weeks annual leave. The application also requested the payment of travelling expenses for dispensary doctors.

Mr. T. Lannon said that as the Board had already made a decision about this matter there was no need to go into it again. "We are not in keeping with the rest of the country," remarked Mr. James Power, Mayor of Waterford, and added "these increases have been granted by other counties and much as I dislike having increases, I think we should pay them here too."

Mr. Lannon—When I see poor people applying to this Board for free shoes being charged 7/- last year and 2/6 this year it is a terrible thing. People can't afford to pay their rates as they are and this application would throw another £10,000 on them. The doctors are not badly off as they are and if members here want to keep in line with the rest of the country where they are concerned they will only be making the poor people worse off.
