## COUNTY COUNCIL ADJOURNS "NO SALARY INCREASE" MOTION

People Can't Afford To Pay Anymore Says Mr. Lannon

A motion proposed by Mr. T. Lannon and seconded by Mr. K. O'Ryan that no salary increases be granted during the coming year was discussed at last Monday's monthly meeting of Waterford Co. Council in Dungarvan. After a short discussion it was agreed to defer further consideration of the matter to next meeting and at Mr. Lannon's request to circulate details of salaries at present being paid to the Council's officials in the meantime.

Proposing the motion Mr. Lannon said that he understood that the Council was to receive an application for a further salary increase for officials which would cost anything from 20 to 30 per cent. In the meantime the Council could discuss the matter properly if he felt that they would not be able to pay the salaries which the officials are at present getting before they get that already announced and they were already paid enough.

The poor people of the County, said Mr. Lannon, cannot afford to pay any more of these increases and the rates have gone sky high as it is. By passing this resolution the Council would be making an effort to put a stop to these increases and they would not be hurting anybody as these officials are already well paid and they are nearly all up to the big salaries.

Mr. K. O'Ryan, T.D. moving an amendment that the Council take no action on the motion said that it was noted that they had been looking from themselves the right to examine an application from the Council for an increase of salaries, whether it was just or not. His objection would be much stronger if the Council had taken any action on the motion. He thought that each one of the Council's officials was in a position instead of salaries. Council officials in the matter of pay, he thought, should be left alone by the Labour Party before the Labour Party would be in a position to understand them of the right they had left, that of coming to the Council to discuss their salaries, would be treated on its merits.

- NO UNTESTED CATTLE MAY NOW ENTER THE AREA
- NO CATTLE MAY MOVE INTO, OR THROUGH, THE AREA WITHOUT A PERMIT

#### MOVEMENT INTO AREA

Permits will only be granted for—  
 (a) Atested and "Blue Card" cattle.  
 (b) 14-Day Testod cattle.  
 (c) Cattle going direct to registered Meat Factories.  
 (d) Cattle moved through the Area without being unloaded.

PERMITS may be obtained at a Garda Station, Customs Frontier Pass, or B.T.E. Office.

#### MOVEMENT INTO HERDS

Only animals which at least 14 days have passed their last test may be moved into a herd in the Area.

#### DEALERS' PREMISES

All incoming 14-Day Tested cattle must first be brought to approved premises in the Area, unless they are brought in by a herd-owner for retention in his own herd.

Cattle may not be moved out of an approved premises except under permit.  
 The owner of an approved premises must keep a record of all cattle moved into or out of the premises.

#### PUBLIC SALES

Any animal which has failed the test may not be exposed at a public sale of cattle.

# High Court Dismisses Clashmore Will Appeal

## CIRCUIT COURT DECISION AFFIRMED

Mr. Justice Haugh, in the High Court on Circuit at Waterford last week affirmed with cost the decision given by Judge Fawcett at the Circuit Court at Clashmore.
