SWEEP RECORD BROKEN AGAIN

£6,167,056 Proceeds For Grand National Draw

The receipts on this year's Irish Sweepstakes were on Saturday's Grand National Draw of £6,167,056, breaking the previous record of £5,115,550 in the 1960 Grand National Draw. This is the biggest sweepstakes we have had yet, said Mr. J. O'Shea, Director of the draw and public, when he opened the draw the 10th in the sweepstakes history, at Ballsbridge, Dublin, on Monday last. The total proceeds exceeded those of last year's Grand National Draw by £1,051,506. 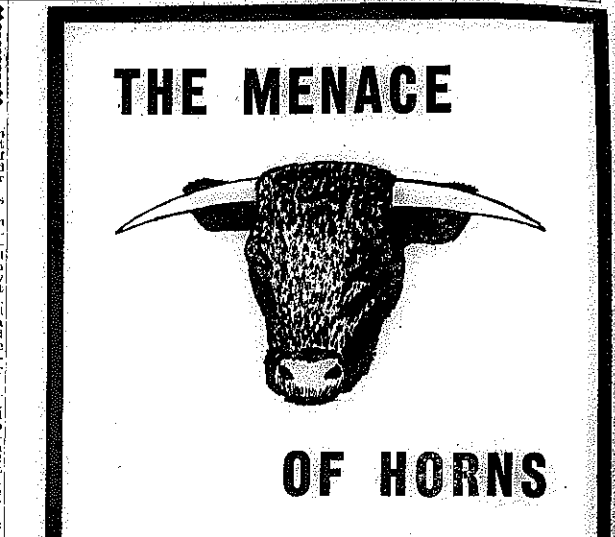
