SPLITTING THE CONSTITUENCY
The proposal in the Electoral Amendment Bill to shear a big slice from the constituency of Waterford has met with a mixed reception by the people concerned. The Government who are sponsoring the Bill have been accused of dishonesty and of attempting to gerrymander certain areas, including Waterford. The Bill proposes to take away from the constituency of the County running roughly in a line from Irish town, Clonmel, through Tullaneema, Cappan, Ashlin, down to Youghal and join it up with South Tipp. The name of the constituency of Deputies will be reduced from four to three.

Travelling Expenses For Officials Becoming A Racket Says Member of Agricultural Committee

More Organisation Urged

I believe that travelling expenses for officials in general are becoming something of a racket and the amount being paid out in very many cases forms a big fraction of the salaries, said Mr. W. Foran at the monthly meeting of the County Agricultural Committee in Dungarvan last Saturday.

LACK OF ORGANISATION
Mr. Foran—There's a lack of organisation and as a result a lot of unnecessary runs are being made.
The C.A.O. said that this was a weak in advance. It did, however, happen on a few occasions that a farmer in an area which had been covered by the C.A.O. was not being served. 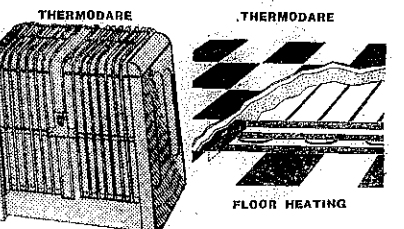

LISMORE AND CAPPOQUIN COW-TESTING ASSOCIATION

The Annual General Meeting of the above Association was held in the Lismore Hotel on Tuesday, March 7, 1961. A large number of members were present. Also in attendance was Mr. M. J. Droney, Cow-Testing Inspector, Supervisor's Report.

The following report on the work for the Association for the year 1960 was submitted by the Supervisor, Miss B. Canning:

The Association consisted of 21 members owning 525 cows at the commencement of the year and 21 members owning 250 cows at the end of the year. Of those 250 cows have completed their lactations.

The average yield of the completed cows was 7069 lbs. of milk and 251.72 lbs. butter-fat with an average test of 4.02%. Valuing butter-fat at 4/- per lb. and skim milk 50/- of whole at 30/- per cwt. the value of produce of the completed cows was £63-6-11 per cow.

The average yield showed an increase of 173 lbs. milk and 10.87 lbs. butter-fat over the average of 1959.

The best cow recorded was a pure-bred British Friesian cow, 25 years old, owned by Mrs. E. O'Sullivan, Eglar, Co. Wick. Lactation of 45 weeks gave a yield of 17,864 lbs. milk, 619.93 butter-fat, average test 4.31, value £171-5-9.

The St. Leger was named at a dinner given in the "Red Lion" in 1778 when it was proposed that the new race be called after Lt. Gen. St. Leger who lived locally.

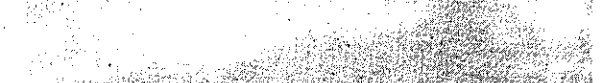
