LISMORE LABOURER ON TRIAL FOR MURDER

Crime Was Purposeless — Says Council

Michael Longford, 42, a farm labourer of Church Street, Lismore, pleaded not guilty to the murder of Sean O'Farrell (64) of Ashbourne House, Dungarvan, on March 19 last when he shot O'Farrell on the Central Criminal Court in Dublin last Monday.

The case for the prosecution was put forward by Mr. C. G. O'Connell, S.C., who said that the murdered man was shot on the morning of March 19, 1959, at about 10.30 a.m. in the yard of Ashbourne House, Dungarvan. O'Farrell was shot in the chest and the bullet entered his back. He was taken to the hospital and died there on March 20, 1959.

The accused knew a great deal about O'Farrell's habits and there had been a quarrel between the two men on the afternoon of March 19, 1959. O'Farrell was shot to death with a double barrel shot gun, and his body was found in the yard of Ashbourne House.
