THE PROBLEM OF AUTOMATION
Mechanisation and automation at the expense of manual workers is a problem which is occupying the thoughts of economists in many countries of the world at present. It is not absent from the thoughts of some of our County Councillors either as they look at the last meeting of the Council.

It was Mr. John Fahey who focused attention on the subject when he put down some questions as to the number of men at present employed throughout the County on road works. He was told by County Engineer, Mr. J. D. Hally that the Council had in employment 24 over-seers and 37 men in all the latter figure being only 10 less than in the corresponding period last year. It was his policy, said Mr. Hally, to reduce costs to a minimum and to stabilise the number of employees in order to ensure continuity of work throughout the year for a certain number rather than have a big number employed for a shorter period.

Mr. Fahey felt that the number of roadworkers in County Waterford was being reduced by a greater percentage than other counties and he expressed the view that the use of more machinery was the cause. "What we are doing," he said, "is exporting human beings and importing machinery and I think that is totally wrong."

Another member of the Council, noted for his wise and often witty statements, Mr. J. M. Gahy, came up with a totally different view when he remarked: "If you put more machinery you will do away with man himself."

IN AMERICA TOO
In America the march of time as far as automation is concerned is providing a problem too. It was a New York newspaper which reported that a new copper mill which can produce more than 200 miles of copper rod in an eight-hour shift.

It is operated by three men— an engineer to set the automatic controls and two men to load bars on the conveyor to the melting furnace and remove the finished rods at the end.

They replace the crew of 20 formerly required for the work. The extent of the problem has been felt in some fields of labour more than others in America, job and the President of the International Association of Machinists made a revealing statement in which he pointed out that one automatic machine being introduced today can introduce 31 different cutting tools and perform hundreds of operations without a single touch from machinists.

The motor car industry in the States, during 1947 employed 69,000 production workers to make 4,500,000 cars. In 1961, it made 3,100,000 more cars with 37,000 fewer workers.

On top of all this it is estimated in America that during the next five years production by automation will eliminate a million jobs and that during the next five years the labour force of the country is growing at the rate of 1,000,000 a year!

Other Councils Clash With Minister On Doctors Salaries
Roscommon County Council has clashed head-on with the Minister for Health on the matter of paying increases to doctors retrospective to August 1, 1960, and has threatened to bring suit to court to test the legality of his actions.

INFECTION FROM ATTESTED COWS
British Doctors Give Two Examples
An article in the British Medical Journal, published recently, describes two incidents where tuberculosis infection in two children was apparently related to the consumption of milk from attested herds.
FIRST INCIDENT
The first incident occurred in November, 1958, when a local doctor in Oxfordshire told his medical officer of health that a five-year-old girl, living in a farm cottage, had developed tuberculosis and that other members of her family, a family nearby and the supplying farmer's family, reacted positively to these families had taken unpasteurized milk.
SECOND INCIDENT
Four months before this discovery, six cows in Oxfordshire were slaughtered when they reacted to tests. One had a tuberculous udder. The second incident, again in Oxfordshire, involved a five-year-old boy and a girl of 13. They were among 100 children tested for tuberculosis and slaughtered. The entire herd—which had been attested since 1947 and had not had a positive reaction since 1951—showed that 35 beasts were positive reactors. They were positive reactors.
