Co. Council Approves In Principle of £2,800,000 Water Scheme

Peak Rate Increase of 10/- in £

Waterford County Council at a special meeting at the Town Hall, Dungarvan, on Tuesday last, agreed in principle with a report submitted by the County Engineer, Mr. J. D. Hilly, covering the proposed water supply scheme for the entire county. As a first step the Council also agreed to the carrying out of two experimental regional schemes, one in the West and one in the East of the County.

Mr. Hilly's report was a voluminous one and in the Council Chambers a number of larger multi-coloured charts were shown. The County Engineer gave details of how the survey was carried out and also that the proposals contained in the report would roughly cost £2,800,000. Over a period of 50 years the average increase on the rates to meet this expenditure would be 53c in the £. The water supply scheme figure but on the installation system a peak increase of 10/- would be reached after 15 years and from then the figure would be on the decrease.

He said that at present the County was reasonably well off as regards water supply in comparison with other counties in the country and gave the percentage having a water supply in Waterford as 143 compared with 8 in others.

There were 85% connections to present schemes which he considered very good.

Mr. J. Quirk said that farmers in the Ballyduff area had refused to connect up with the new scheme there because of a cost which was high but Mr. G. Heskin disagreed with this and said that he knew a number who had taken connections.

Mr. C. Curran said that the problem was a demand for water in the county and it would have to be met.

Mr. Hilly then said that while the increase on the rates might be substantial it was not excessive and that the scheme would be a long-term investment.

Mr. T. Kyne, said that in the years ahead the county would have to face a very competitive period in industry and agriculture and even though these schemes would cost a lot of money they would help to meet this competition.

I think, he said, we should approve of the recommendation and I believe the Council just cannot afford not to do so.

Mr. D. Drohan said that people should not be forced into something which they do not want. A canvass should be carried out in each district and they should be able to make up their own minds.

I don't think, said Mr. Drohan, that it would be fair for the Council to reach any decision without such a canvass.

Mr. B. Walsh said that the cost of the scheme as mentioned in the report was very high and he thought it could be done much cheaper than that. He thought the scheme an excellent one and from his point of view would not be an economic job at all.

I such work was put for contract, he said, I am sure it could be done for less than the cost estimated in this report.

The Chairman said that one of the advantages of a piped supply was that it ensured a constant supply of good quality water.

Mr. Walsh—the scheme is fine as viewed by the Co. Engineer but the point is to do not think the ratepayers can stand up to it. Then there is the snag of how you can put 10/- on the rates for people who already have provided their own water schemes.

Mr. Quirk felt that the people could not afford such a lavish scheme.

The Manager said that with the various voluntary organisations such as the N.F.A., Macra Na Feirme, etc. before anything was decided to get their views.

Finally on the proposal of Mr. Kyne, seconded by Mr. J. Butler, the Council agreed to adopt the County Engineer's report and to approve the carrying out as a first step of two regional schemes, one at each end of the county.
