### VACCINATION PREVENTS CONTAGIOUS ABORTION

**Vaccination Prevents Contagious Abortion**

A noticeable reduction over the last few years, especially under the Scheme operated by the Department in the demand for Strain 19 for vaccination of heifer calves against contagious abortion suggests that farmers do not appear to appreciate fully the losses caused through the incidence of this disease.

Contagious abortion is, as its name implies, capable of spreading very rapidly, and the fact that it has been free of it for a long time is no guarantee of immunity.

The disease can be prevented by vaccination. Heifer calves between the ages of four and eight months which are inoculated with the vaccine known as Strain 19 are safeguarded against the disease. Primarily the treatment is for the protection of breeding heifers, but often animals intended for fattening are in fact bought for breeding and it is advisable, therefore, to have all heifer calves vaccinated at the right age.

Adult cows should not be vaccinated except on veterinary advice.

The cost of vaccination is not only small in relation to the value of the milk and calves that may be lost through infection, but it has been brought down to a specially moderate figure by an arrangement between the Department of Agriculture and the veterinary profession.

An abortion not only means the loss of milk and milk in the one case, it means also the disease is there threatening the rest of the cows on the farm. Vaccination of the heifers at the right time, will leave their owner's mind at ease.
