Restoration of The Irish College, Rome - A condition will be taken up on Sunday next at Churches in the United Parishes of Knockanoo, Kiltwatermore, and Glendine, to help in the repairs to the Irish College, Rome. 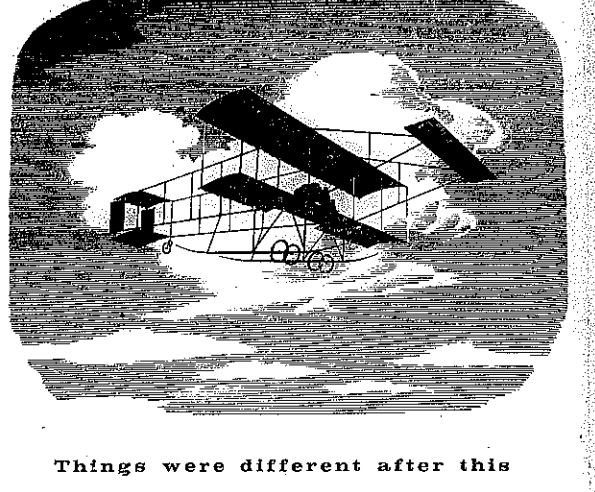
DERELICT HOUSES AT CAPPOQUIN TO BE CLEARED

At their special meeting in Dungarvan, the Dungarvan Waterford County Council agreed to purchase a number of derelict houses at Barrack Street, Cappoquin, to demolish them and to clear the site. The price to be paid to the owners for the houses is £200 and the County Engineer estimated the cost of clearing the site at £136. Mr. N. Walsh, Vice-Chairman, who presided at the meeting, said that the houses in question were in a state of disrepair and were a real eyesore which they had to go to the trouble of demolishing. DAIL QUESTION ON C.I.E. PENSIONS

Mr. Sean Ormonde, T.D., asked the Minister for Transport & Power if he is aware that a number of pensioners are in receipt of pensions, in some cases, as low as £4 a week. He asked the Minister to take steps, if necessary by the introduction of legislation to increase their pensions in keeping with the increased cost of living and the changed circumstances of the pensioners. In his reply the Minister said that C.I.E. Superannuation Schemes had been introduced under the provisions of the C.I.E. Act, 1958. He said that the extent to which C.I.E. would be able to increase pensions would depend on the amount of the pension fund by the pensioners concerned and by C.I.E. He said that the full cost of any increase in pensions to existing C.I.E. pensioners would fall to be met by C.I.E. in the form of a grant.

He has been informed that the Estate has been taken over by the Land Commission and will be dealt with in accordance with their usual procedure. The claims of all eligible applicants in the vicinity will be carefully considered before a final decision as to its disposal is made.'
