Council Chairman In Ruthless Attitude At Rates Meeting

Public Can't Have Best Of Two Worlds

TO bring the matter to a head he was prepared to do something ruthless, said Chairman Mr. C. Curran, at the reconvened Estimates Meeting of Waterford Co. Council in Dungarvan on Tuesday last. In order to reduce the rates he said people would have to realise that it could only be done the hard way by cutting the services. In proposing a rate of 45/6, a reduction of 3/8 on the rate submitted by the Estimates Committee and an increase of 9d. over last year, he suggested cuts totalling £28,549 in various services. The proposal was carried by the Chairman's casting vote.

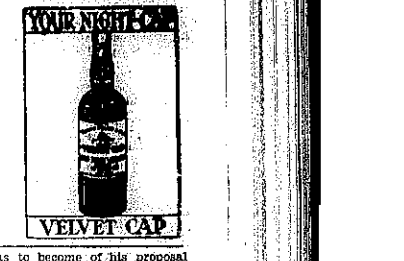
After a five hour session a fortnight previous at the end of which they wound up by striking a rate of 48/6 in the £, the Council following a letter from the Minister to the County Manager reconvened on Tuesday to again consider the position. At the meeting held on March 12, the Manager informed the Council that he was not prepared to accept the rate of 45/6 as the Council failed to show where the reductions and economies were to be carried out. The Minister in his letter read at last Tuesday's meeting directed that as the Council had failed to do this they should be reconvened.
