DELAY IN COTTAGE BUILDING SCHEMES

A statement by Councillor John Fahy at last Monday's County Council meeting that not a single cottage had been built in the county since 1949 set me thinking. Certainly I agree with Mr. Fahy when he stated that this was a shocking thing to have to say.

IMPORTANT NOTICE to Herd Owners and Cattle Traders

COUNTY DUBLIN including DUBLIN CITY is now a CLEARANCE AREA

TESTING
The owner of any herd of cattle which has not yet been tested under the Scheme must apply for a test to the Department before 1st May, 1962.

MOVEMENT
Cattle may not be moved into County Dublin without a permit, unless they are cattle from a clear herd in a Clearance Area. Permits may be obtained at a Garda Station or B.T.E. Office.

UNCERTIFIED CATTLE
Cattle intended for immediate slaughter which are brought into Co. Dublin under permit, must be moved into approved 'detention premises' unless they are going directly to the Dublin Cattle Market or to Dublin Port for export. Owners of hirages and accommodation paddocks intended to be used as 'detention premises' should apply immediately to the Department for approval, if they have not already done so.

14-DAY TESTED CATTLE
Cattle brought into Co. Dublin under permit for sale as 14-day tested must be moved into premises specially approved for that purpose.

PUBLIC SALES
Any animal which has failed a tuberculosis test may not be exposed at public sale of cattle in Co. Dublin other than the Dublin Cattle Market.
