Procedure Was Legal But Ineffective —Law Adviser Tells Health Board

New Salary Scale For Secretary Challenged

At the resumed adjourned April Meeting of the Waterford Health Authority held at the Co. Home, Dungarvan, on Wednesday last week, the Law Adviser to the Authority Mr. R. J. Farrell, Solicitor, Waterford, stated that the procedure at the March meeting in relation to the creation of certain posts had been legal but that such an act would not prejudice the rights of any member who wished to raise points on the matter at a later stage. The discussion which lasted over two and a half hours was punctuated by a number of heated exchanges.

It will be recalled that when the Authority met for their monthly meeting on April 16, the presiding Chairman, Mr. Norman Walsh, who occupied the Chair in the absence through illness of Ald. W. Kenneally, refused to sign the minutes of the March meeting on the grounds that by doing so he might commit the Authority to something which appeared to him to have been illegally done at that meeting in regard to the creation of the posts of Secretary and Accountant. He adjourned the meeting without transacting any business until Wednesday, April 25, and requested that the Authority's Law Adviser, Mr. Farrell, attend that meeting to give them his opinion on what had been done.

FRESH AGENDA
In the meantime a fresh agenda had been sent out which stated that in addition to the items previously listed, business unfinished at the March meeting should be dealt with. The agenda also stated that the post of Accountant should be included. A similar proposal had been rejected at the March meeting.

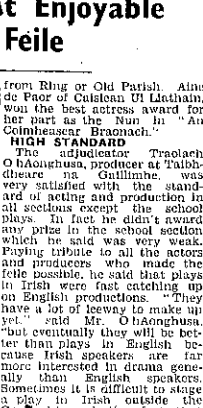
