They had been libelled in an article published in The Sunday Telegraph, of August 27, 1961, written under the name of Clive Cockburn.

Mr. Diarmuid P. Sheridan, who with Mr. James Modulle, S.C., and Mr. Roger O'Hanrahan, S.C., instructed by Peter O'Connor & Son, appeared for the plaintiffs. Mr. Justice Murnaghan said that the actions had been settled on terms satisfactory to the plaintiffs. He said on a statement written under the name of Clive Cockburn, Mr. W. O. B. Fitzgerald, S.C., instructed by John McDowell & Co., appeared for the Sunday Telegraph Ltd., said that the defendants wished to take this opportunity of saying that they never intended the article to cast any reflection on the plaintiffs, or to assert that the plaintiffs were concerned in any way with the death or disappearance of Laurence Griffin.

The defendants further wished to express regret that the plaintiffs should be aggrieved by reason of the publication of the article, and they wished to reassure the plaintiffs that the article was never intended to cause any grief or damage to them.

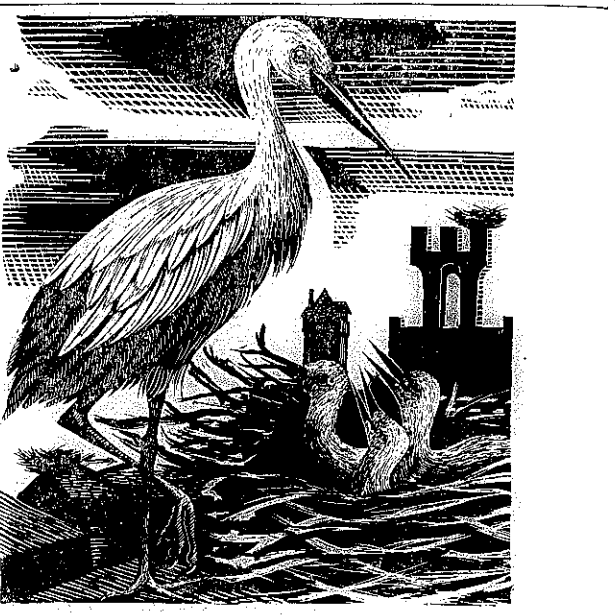
