Flare Up On Engineers' Salary Direction

A direction from Local Government Minister, Mr. N. Blaney, directing that revised salary scales be paid to the Chief Assistant and nine Assistant Co. Engineers caused a flare-up at last Monday's meeting of Waterford County Council during which Mr. W. Foran said that the Council was just a phantom.

The Council on two previous occasions had rejected an application to grant the increases and the Engineers concerned then appealed to the Minister as allowed by the regulations. Mr. T.
