## PENSMAN takes you Behind the Spotlight

**THE PLOUGH AND FURROW** is the appropriate title of the County Waterford Macra Year Book which has been revised after a lapse of seven years and is now on sale.

The first issue of the "Plough and Furrow" was published in January, 1953, and for a period of three years it came out every quarter until it lapsed in 1956 in an editorial the new book is described as "the official mouthpiece of County Waterford Young Farmers and the channel through which the rural community can be reached bringing to them new ideas, progressive methods, current experiences.

With goodwill messages from Most Rev. Dr. Cahalan, Bishop of Waterford and Lismore, Archbishop of Dublin, Mr. Sean Lemass, Mr. P. Smith, Minister for Agriculture and Mr. Michael O'Connell, Chairman of the National Council of Macra, the book contains articles from experts and laymen on all aspects of rural life and activity. Not least, the Irish language is well-worked as it contains two well-written articles in Irish.

This Year Book is one which every farmer, young and old, can read gainfully as it contains a wealth of information and advice as well as articles aimed at providing entertaining light reading. Priced at the modest half-crown it is well worth every penny.

## THE GAP AND THE STATUS

The country had hardly recovered from the body blow it received from the United Nations in a report from a U.N. working group which listed Ireland with among others, Greece and Spain as a "developed country" when the Government's White Paper on closing the "embassy" came and output was issued. ## MACRA YEAR BOOK LAUNCHED AT CO. EXECUTIVE DINNER

### Objectives Of Macra Should Be Balanced

Speaking at the Third Annual Dinner of the Co. Waterford Executive Macra on Feb. 14 at the Grand Hotel, Traamore, on last Sunday night, Rev. Fr. T. Fitzgerald, St. John's, Waterford, said that the Macra organisation would soon be coming of age. Founded in the spring of 1945 its leaders were men of clear ideas and of action and set out as the prime objective of the organisation the education of young farmers in the theory and practice of agriculture and also to teach the ways and means of vegetation in rural areas.

"By and large," continued Fr. Fitzgerald "this policy has been pursued through the years but I have heard it said of late that Macra have pursued the second aim to the detriment of the first. I do not know how much truth, if any, there is in this, but if there is it is an injustice I think now would be an opportune time to put it right. We are entering a historic era during which national duties will be lowered and countries will become interdependent."

Congratulating the organisation on its success and the wonderful contribution it has made to the national life, Fitzgerald said that he was sure that as we approach the bicentenary of the Macra an honourable place among the nations of whatever community it found itself in and that would be due in no small way to the contribution being made by it.

Mr. Michael Owen Fogarty, President of the National Council of Macra, who was guest of honour at the dinner, said that he would on behalf of the Council like to say how much they appreciated the help and assistance from all those who had suffered losses during the recent snowstorm and they all trusted that the help they had received from the Department of Agriculture would be as good as theirs.

Referring to recent events in the international sphere he said that they should remember that Macra's role was to teach the young farmers that they must rely on themselves and that without expecting assistance from anyone. He paid a special tribute to the Department of Agriculture.

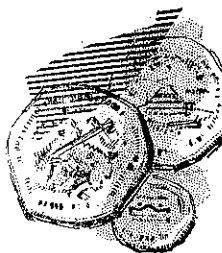
