RABBIT DAZZLERS CREATE PANIC AMONG STOCK

But Gardai Can Prosecute Under Old Act

Persons who enter farm lands at night to dazzle rabbits and who disturb stock can be prosecuted by the Gardai Authorities as poachers. This was stated during a discussion on the menace to farm stock from dazblers present which took place at last Saturday's monthly meeting of the Co. Waterford Committee of Agriculture in Dungarvan.

Mr. John Drohan, who raised the matter, stated that he had received several complaints, especially from the Kilmohr area about the menace of rabbit dazblers. While no one objected to the killing of rabbits, he said that in the middle of the night young men jumped over fences and turned on these powerful lights and created panic among stock, especially horses who ran madly all over the place.

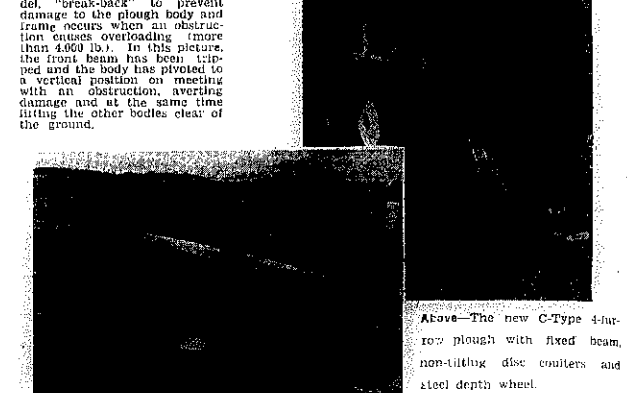
