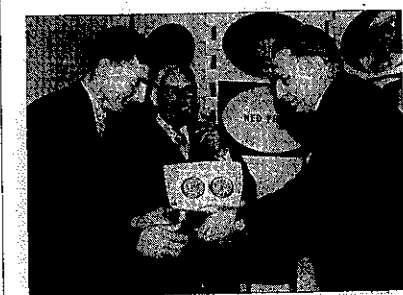

OBITUARIES

Mr. M. Puge

The death of Mr. M. Puge, a native of Ballyshannon, who died on Wednesday, March 13, after a very brief illness at the District Hospital, was the source of much regret in Dungarvan and district. He was aged 78 years.

The late Mr. Puge was a member of the Dungarvan very early on. He joined the clerical staff of the Waterford County Council and for forty years up to his retirement ten years ago he served his superiors well.
