Plan To Convert Priory House To Clinic Causes Uproar

Health Authority Rejects Proposal

Priory House, Dungarvan, which caused several stormy sessions at meetings of Waterford County Council when its purchase (at £3,700) for conversion into a Public Health Clinic was discussed in 1954 and 1955, once again hit the headlines in a heated discussion during which Mr. T. Lannen condemned its suitability in its uncertain terms at the monthly meeting of the Waterford Health Authority in Dungarvan last Monday.

The matter appeared on the agenda as "raising of health centre" and Mr. Griffin suggested that the matter be deferred to allow those members who knew nothing about the background of the case to have a look at Priory House to form their own views as its suitability. Mr. Lannen vehemently objected. "Throw it out," he said, "and let that be decided here now."

Mr. Hynes told him that the Department would make a grant available if the Clinic was to be placed elsewhere. Mr. Foran—Have the Department merit sanctioned Priory House as being suitable. Chairman—Apparently you are not planning for the Clinic there has gone on with the knowledge and consent of the Department who have been approving and accepting plans for it which have been going up for the past three or four years.

NEW SPEED LIMITS FOR CO. WATERFORD

13 Fatal Accidents In County In 1962

Waterford County is to have new speed limits which are to come into effect on Monday next. Mr. J. D. Harty, County Engineer, speaking at a Press Conference in his Office in Dungarvan on Tuesday last, Mr. J. D. Harty, B.E., Co. Engineer, emphasised the fact that this was the first serious effort made to deal with the problems of road accidents.

The objective of the Press Conference, Mr. Harty said, was to seek the co-operation of the general public in ensuring the effective operation of the speed limits and also to explain how they were made. The speed limits, he said, were expected to be welcomed by the public as a means of reducing the number and severity of accidents on the road.
