LETTERS TO THE EDITOR T.D. CHALLENGES PENSMAN—Dear Sir—In last week's issue of your paper "Pensman" took the members of the Urban Council to task for failing to put the rates for 1963 up by an amount that would make them lower by one shilling than the 1962 rates.

Dear Sir—I am sure the other members, always welcome contributors, would be very careful not to give away the most important function we have that of saying how much and on what the rates are to be spent.

When he is cutting the Manager's estimate by 1s. 8d. to 4s. 4d. I would like him to remember that instead of reduced services the Council have been pressed throughout the year to provide extra for such services as lighting, roads, housing and sewerage, etc. Again I would draw his attention to a statement by Mr. Halley, B.E.C. Chairman to the Co. Council on their meeting on 8-4-63.

In his roads statement he states:— "With regard to Urban Roads, the only money available is £1,200 for maintenance which is the amount the Urban Council agreed to provide, but I want to make it clear that the Co. Council is the Road Authority and responsible for providing adequately for the roads in the Urban Area not the Urban Council. The present population of the roads in the Urban Area is a figure of 12,200 is inadequate for the ordinary requirements. The Urban grant of £1,200 will provide as far as possible for the restoration of the roads

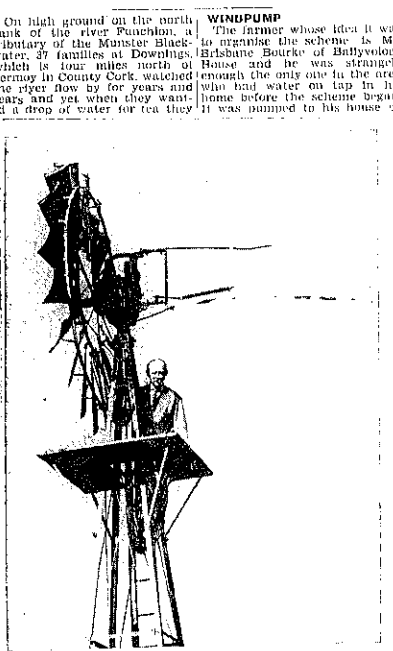

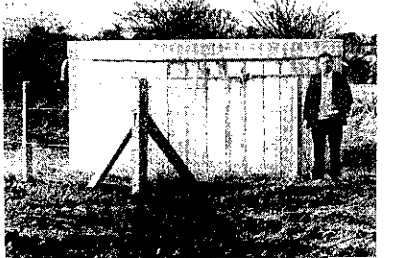
