POTATO BLIGHT

SYMPTOMS OF BLIGHT

Blight is the most destructive of all diseases affecting the potato crop. The time between the outbreak stage and virtually complete destruction of the foliage of an unpropagated crop is usually only three weeks.

The fungus attacks and penetrates the aerial parts of the potato plant, further progress is made by its invasion of the tubers which subsequently rot. Plants may be attacked at any stage of their growth. However, the disease is not generally seen until towards the end of July or early in August, as it is only then that the weather is sufficiently warm for the disease to develop and attract attention. Dampness and a certain degree of warmth are necessary for the development of the disease.
