SOLUTION SUGGESTED IN DUNGARVAN CLINIC DISPUTE

Has Poisoned Public Life For Seven Years Says Councillor

Priority House, Dungarvan, the purchase of which for conversion into a Health Clinic has bedevilled discussions at meetings of Waterford County Council for many years and in latter months caused stormy sessions at meetings of the Waterford Health Authority was once again mentioned at the monthly meeting of the Health Authority in Dungarvan last Monday. Another full-blooded discussion was brewing up but it was cut short when Councillor C. Curran asked the members to refrain from saying any more on the subject until he put down a motion for the next meeting which he hoped would finalise the matter.

At last Monday's meeting of the Waterford Health Authority in Dungarvan, Mr. W. Collins, following the division on proposals to appoint additional medical Officers drew attention to the fact that members who had been present when the meeting started had disappeared and asked that their remarks be recorded.

MOVE TO CREATE CHIEF MEDICAL OFFICER POSTS DEFEATED

Proposals for the integration of the Chief Medical Officer's Department were placed before the meeting at a later stage by the County Manager who told the members of a conference held in the County Council on the subject of the Department of Health in Dublin. It had been decided he said that following the resignation of Dr. O'Connell, the County Medical Officer, Dr. Maughan would become the Chief Medical Officer of the Health Authority. He then referred to a letter received from the Department in Dublin which stated that the Chief Medical Officer would require the services of three assistants which would be approved if the members were in agreement.
