A CASE FOR HIGHER

At last Monday's quarterly meeting of Waterford County Council in Dungarvan, a letter from an official of the Department of Local Government was read transmitting the advice of the Minister, Mr. Noel Blyden, to the Council to restore a cut of £17,000 made in this year's roads estimates. The Minister had been included in the estimates by the County Engineer for restoration of the county.

The Department's letter states that this sum should be restored in order to keep the roads which were already in pretty bad shape from deteriorating further and to tell the members that they should adopt a realistic attitude towards the problem and follow the advice of the County Engineer.

The big stick was waved when the letter said that unless the sum contained in the letter was followed the Council would not qualify for the present year.

This may be all very well for the Minister and his officials up in Dublin, but what about the ratepayers of County Waterford, and the weight of modern traffic the upkeep of roads will become a bigger and more serious problem as time goes on.

We all agree that the roads should be kept in as perfect a state of repair as possible, but where arterial highways and main roads are concerned, I wonder the time has now arrived where the upkeep of these should be financed from central funds.

After all as the County Manager and the County Engineer pointed out on Monday's meeting it is not the light and traffic that is doing the damage and tearing up our road surfaces, but the huge lorries which are laden with goods which pass through the county from one place to the next.

Without doubt the tendency for future years will be for traffic to grow in density and volume on the roads. Commercial firms are building ever bigger and ever heavier vans, trucks and motor trucks, and a nightmare to meet some of these as they are on narrow roads—and are using roads to the conclusion of their life span.

This being so, I do believe, and I express the view of a big number when I say that the upkeep of the main roads over which this heavy traffic passes should be nationalised or at least subsidised as to nine-tenths of the cost by the Government. The burden has now become too great for local ratepayers to bear.

MINISTER WANTS CO. COUNCIL TO SPEND £17,000 MORE ON MAIN ROAD REPAIRS

Warning Of Rapid Deterioration Within Few Years

Members of Waterford County Council at the Council's quarterly meeting in Dungarvan on Monday last, heard a letter read from the Department of Local Government which stated that unless they were prepared to restore the cut of £17,000 for main roads repairs made at the Council's estimates meeting earlier in the year they would not qualify for the full grants allocated to them for the current year. The letter added that the Council should have regard to the advice of the County Engineer concerning the need for undertaking a realistic programme for the preservation of main roads which are showing signs of deterioration.

The Council by 9 votes to 5 (there were 9 members absent from the meeting) refused to restore the £17,000 as suggested in the Department's letter. The text of the Department's letter regarding the Council's rates provision for roads works in the coming year stated:—

The Minister is advised that the County Engineer had proposed to undertake in the current year on main roads an urgently necessary otherwise these roads will continue to deteriorate rapidly leading to the loss of the resources invested in them in the past as well as the early need for complete and costly reconstruction. A realistic restoration programme on the lines recommended by the County Engineer can do much to avoid such loss and expense. The execution of work of this nature is a common feature in the case of the Minister would be prepared to accept the reduced provision for ordinary roads works provided the overall rate provision for ordinary roads works for main and county roads is maintained, as a minimum, at last year's level. This is the minimum provision which will be accepted as qualifying for the full grants allocated to the Council for the current year.

The Council should, however, have regard to the advice of the County Engineer concerning the need for undertaking a realistic programme for the preservation of main roads which are showing signs of deterioration. It is also desirable that the provision for the surface dressing of main roads should be increased.

IN DIFFICULT POSITION

Mr. J. D. Hally, County Engineer, told the Council that they had refused to provide £17,000 which he had included in the road works estimate for restoration work on main roads this year. Half of this amount would be recouped by the Department.

Due to the increased volume of heavy traffic we are seeing on the roads was going to deteriorate rapidly unless the County Engineer made annual provision for the necessary restoration work. "If this is not done said Mr. Hally, "the Council will find themselves in a difficult position in a few years."

Chairman pointed out that the only reason why the Council had cut out this £17,000 was the unavailability of money and the amount which the ratepayers could provide.

Mr. F. Roche said that there was no doubt but that the main roads of the county were deteriorating.

Mr. J. Quirk was told that the Council did in fact provide £30,000 for main road repairs in this year's estimate.

Mr. Quirk met a tourist lately and he commented very much on the fine roads we had and now here we are being asked to spend more money on them while we can't give the ordinary people any kind of proper roads until this thing is cleared up I would not be for providing more money for main roads.

Mr. K. T. O'Connell said that if you don't you will lose the grants.

Chairman—That is not so, we will only lose a pro rata amount. The Council has in fact provided a lot of money for main roads.

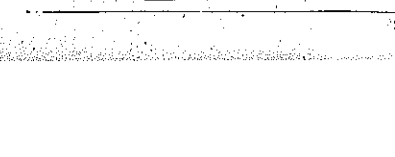
